TODAYS READINGS

Jesus has compassion on the crowd that has need of teaching and guidance. His teaching is given with authority, it is confirmed by miracles. It brings together those who share his message. The Church always needs shepherds who are prepared to teach and build up the unity of the flock.

First Reading

Jeremiah 23:1-6

The 'weeping prophet' is charged with addressing the scandal of bad shepherds and scandalous shepherding. Jeremiah simultaneously gives us clear insight into Yahweh's concern for his flock. It's both a warning to leadership and a consoling and reassuring message to the people. Splendid in his ability to speak on behalf of Yahweh, Jeremiah is signalling how, in the interest of ensuring that not one will be lost, some will now have to be moved aside as confidence is restored.

Second Reading

Ephesians 2:13-18

Christ has opened for all the possibility and the means of salvation. Nobody is far away now, differences and difficulties created by the law have been abolished; triumph on and through the cross have meant the end of hostility and barrier; peace now reigns and the one Spirit is an open accessible path for all peoples to the Father.

Gospel Reading

Mark 6:30-34

The need for rest and reflection is the starting point in today's gospel. The apostles have ministered well; it's time for a little time away. But it is short lived. The people are hungry for the message, the chief pastor knows the needs of his sheep – and he doesn't leave it till later – he does it now and 'at some length.' The Master is setting the standard for pastors.
