The Deep End • The Good Samaritan

Parables are never what they seem. They have a clever way of enticing us to figure out what is really going on beneath the surface. One of the real questions in this parable is: Who offers correct worship to God? Jesus spoke about a God who was not concerned with the constraints of the Temple, but who was on the streets. Look at what the Samaritan did for the man on the road: he bound his wounds. he poured oil on them, he took him to an inn. These are all action words. The emphasis in this parable is on action and compassion. The Samaritan is considered to be an outcast, yet Jesus makes him the hero of this story, no doubt causing outrage to those who were listening to Him. The priest and Levite were most likely carrying oil and wine on their person; in the case of the priest, these items were needed for making sacrifices

in the Temple. Coincidently these items were also a vital part of a first century first aid kit, needed for cleaning the wounds of the injured man.

The lawyer is concerned with the limits to 'love of neighbour.' But there are no limits, no boundaries, no outsiders in God's Kingdom. Holiness is not separation from the marginalised, but proximity to them.

Since once again Lord, I have neither bread, nor wine, nor altar, I will raise myself beyond these symbols, up to the pure majesty of the real itself; I will make the whole Earth my altar and on it will offer you all the labours and sufferings of the world.

Reflection for weekend 13th & 14th July

The sacraments are 7 meeting points, Meeting 3: The Eucharist: How do we celebrate the Eurcharist (the Holy Mass)? 1st Part of Holy Mass: The Liturgy of the Word (continued): After the Gloria, we can sit down. Prick up your ears! The **Readings** are read aloud to us. "The word of God is something alive and active: it cuts like any double-edged sword but more finely." (Heb 4:12). God wants to tell us something. Now the Gospel is proclaimed: Jesus Himself is speaking to us, Alleluia! That's why we all stand up. Listen carefully! Imagine you are sitting 3 metres from Jesus in a tree, like Zacchaeus - and he calls: Come down to me! After the gospel, the priest gives a **Homily**. He explains God's word to us. The Creed, which comes after the homily, is something for courageous and faithful people. We say: this is true. This is what we believe and we stand by it. The Creed connects us with all Christians in the world. Now we can do something for others: pray the Intercessions with your whole heart. You can tell God your own petitions in silence and pray for your friends. God hears you. Tune in next week to explore the 2nd Part of the Holy Mass.
