Phone companies offer special incentives if we upgrade to the latest smartphone, while car dealers are constantly trying to convince us to trade in our older car for a brand new model. And it wasn't so long ago that all the talk was about buying a starter home or getting on the property ladder. The idea is that we can always go bigger and do better for ourselves. If we think about it, most of us will admit we have more than we need to get by, but there is still a drive to acquire more 'stuff' The rich man in today's parable was busying himself with upgrading. Faced with a lack of sufficient space to store all his crop and his goods, he decided to build bigger barns. Satisfied, he then sat back to enjoy the finer things in life, to 'eat, drink, have a good time'.

But Jesus offers a gentle reminder that, really, these are not the things that matter. After all, we can't take any of these treasures with us. First Reading Ecclesiastes (Qoheleth) 1:2,2:21-23
