# Third Sunday of Advent The Deep End • Light and Darkness

Last week we were introduced to John the Baptist as part of our Advent journey. We hear his story again today, and in this account, from the fourth gospel, we hear John's voice and his testimony about lesus. Light and darkness is a key theme of the fourth gospel and its opening verses proclaims that this light has always shone in the dark; the darkness cannot overpower it. The evangelist goes on to tell us that John the Baptist's mission is that he has been sent by God to 'speak for the light'. John is a lightbearer, he is not the light, but he points to the light. He is a witness to the light of God in our world, a light that cannot be put out.

We celebrate this light today on Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means 'rejoice'; we light the pink candle and we celebrate with joy. It might be a good opportunity to ask today: 'who have been the light-bearers on your own faith journey'? Who testified to the Light of God and passed the torch on to you? We thank God for them.

Lord there is much darkness in society and in our church ... We become cynical and settle for mediocrity. We thank you that someone always comes on the scene, sent by you as a witness to speak for the light ... teachers, community leaders, grandparents, children, a friend ... they bear witness to the rest of us that somewhere in the dark a light shines that darkness cannot overcome. ### **Today's Readings.**

As we journey in Advent and look forward to Christmas we celebrate our joy at the coming of the Lord. Joy, prayer and thanksgiving should characterise Christian worship. Because the man of integrity has come with good news for the poor, we can exult for joy. But his coming will mean that we also will practice justice and integrity.

### **First Reading**

#### Isaiah 61:1-2, 10-11

This reading from Isaiah comes in two parts. First, the Prophet reflects on the effect of God's presence: it has enabled him to bring 'good news,' and that word has transformed life for the poor. prisoners and those with broken hearts. In a second moment, the prophet offers a psalm-like prayer of praise, as he rejoices in God and in the freshness of life that has begun as a result of his prophetic word.

#### Second Reading 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

The first letter to the Thessalonians is the earliest text in the New Testament. It is born of a very deep human need for reassurance and hope. Paul had evangelised the Thessalonians and moved on quickly. Now they are discouraged and fearful as some of their members have died. Paul in his letter tries to reassure them and now, as he ends it, he encourages them to find joy anew. loy will be found in prayer as they encounter Christ and fulfil his will on their journey to the fulfilment that he has promised.

#### NEW ROSS PARISH WEEK-END MASS SCHEDULE

Some years ago, seeing the need to update the Parish Week-end Mass Schedule, the Parish Pastoral Council sought the opinions and suggestions of all parishioners. As a result of that consultation, the present arrangement was arrived at :-(6.00pm Saturday Vigil; Sunday 9.00am, 10.am .12.00pm : Sunday evening 6.00pm).Since then ,with the closure of the Augustinian Church, the Parish Clergy have taken on the added responsibility of providing daily (8.00am) and Sunday (8.00am) Masses – plus Holy Week and Easter Ceremonies - for the Carmelite Sisters. The Pastoral Council is of the opinion that the time has come to re-visit the schedule. With declining attendances. it is felt that smaller congregations at each

Mass lessens the sense of community.

Presently in New Ross there are 8 week-end Masses (2 x Rosbercon, I x Mt. Carmel & 6 x Parish). The supply clearly out-strips the demand. Another consideration is the declining number of Clergy in the Diocese. New Ross parish has been fortunate in retaining the services three priests up to the present. It is certain that will not be the case in the near future. The Pastoral Council is anxious to look ahead and plan for that future. Therefore, as a first step in that process, it invites opinions from parishioners as to the future of the 6.00pm SUNDAY EVENING MASS. It would be appreciated if responses were received before Christmas.
