Archbishop Michael Neary to lead annual Croagh Patrick Pilgrimage on Ireland's holy mountain

Archbishop Michael Neary, Archbishop of Tuam, will lead the annual Reek Sunday Pilgrimage which will take place this weekend on Ireland's holy mountain Croagh Patrick. The archbishop will be joined by Bishop Fintan Monahan of Killaloe and by pilgrims from across Ireland for the pilgrimage which has been undertaken for almost 1500 years. Croagh Patrick 2,510ft/765m), dominates the landscape of southwest Mayo both spiritually and physically. The pilgrimage is associated with Saint Patrick who, in 441, spent forty days and nights fasting on the summit, following the example of Christ and Moses. During Reek Sunday, Mass

will be celebrated every hour on the summit, beginning at 8.00am, with the final Mass commencing at 2.00pm. Father Stephen Farragher will celebrate Mass as Gaeilge at 10.00am. Archbishop Neary will celebrate Mass at 11.00am and Bishop Fintan Monahan will celebrate Mass at 12.00noon. Pilgrims may also avail of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) at the summit from 7.30am to 2.00pm. Croagh Patrick is a physically demanding pilgrimage. Intending pilgrims should make themselves aware in advance of health and safety information about the mountain. Pilgrims should also heed the instructions of stewards, the mountain rescue teams, Order of Malta, and Gardaí.

The Deep End • Living the Dream

Some of us may hear today's Gospel reading and think: 'Well, what is so wrong with that?' In a lot of ways, the actions of the man in the parable make sense. He has had a good harvest (presumably a result of his own hard work) and is making provisions for the future – building bigger barns to store his crops, ensuring he has enough to live on for the coming years, allowing himself to enjoy the fruits of his labour. He is living the dream! He is a good businessman, he has achieved security in life, so why shouldn't he 'eat, drink, have a good time'?

Yet God brands him a 'fool.' Why? As it turns out, the man is to die very soon. He certainly can't take all his treasure with him. He has not thought beyond his own enjoyment. He is living only for this life, without any thought for the bigger picture. As Jesus warns: 'a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.' Furthermore, there is no indication that the considered sharing his wealth with anyone else. His focus is 'me, me, me.' He comes across as selfish and greedy. What does he have to show for his life? Yes, he had a good time, but has he helped anyone else, or left the world a better place?

We do not need to renounce all our worldly possessions or stop planning for the future, but we do need to keep things in their proper perspective.

Reflection for weekend 3rd & 4th August

Short Catechism for Children, Parents and Everyone. We explore The Sacraments: The Sacrament of Penance (continued): Sins and Errors: A sin may not be dismissed as "just a mistake." Mistakes and sins are 2 different things. A mistake is not a sin at all but a misunderstanding, getting a sum wrong, for example, or unintentionally forgetting someone's birthday. We humans, however, are not only capable of mistakes, we are capable of evil. Jesus has not come to correct our mistakes, but to die for our sins and to give us forgiveness. Is it already a sin if I would like to do something forbidden? No. It is only a temptation. To resist a temptation is a great accomplishment. It makes heaven rejoice. And you can rejoice too. It is a temptation simply to take the football that is lying around. It is a temptation to want secretly to watch a forbidden video. It is a temptation when you would like to put the know-itall down. If you do not do it, you win the battle against evil as Jesus did in the desert. A quote from Arnold H Glasow (1905-1998) American humourist: "Temptation usually comes in through a door that has been deliberately left open." To end, a quote from Scripture: "Be awake to all the dangers, stay firm in the faith; be brave and be strong" (1Co 16:13). Tune in next week to explore more of the Sacrament of Confession.
