HISTORY REPEATS ITSELF.....BUT ONLY JUST

THE WEXFORD HISTORICAL SOCIETY celebrates the centenary of its founding this year. The Society consists of local people with a special interest in history - local and national where the latter impinges on the former. It produces a JOURNAL annually containing articles of historical events concerning the County.

In the 1988/89 edition Celestine Murphy writes a very interesting piece on LUKE WADDINGE, Bishop of Ferns in the 17th century. The following is based on that article. He was a native of Wexford town and a member of a very prosperous, landed and merchant Catholic family. Such powerful Catholic families are interesting in their own way. At this time Ireland was unique in Europe in that the majority population did not follow the religion of the reigning monarch. Therefore there existed an uneasy relationship between the two; a lingering doubt that loyalty to the Pope was stronger than loyalty to the King / Queen. This fear was realised in 1641 when the native Irish demanded religious freedom. The Catholic middleclass joined the insurgents. What followed was the destruction of Wexford town by Oliver Cromwell.

Executions, evictions, confiscation of property and exile out of the county followed. The Waddinges lost all and in 1651 young LUKE WADDINGE escaped to Europe and settled in Paris, where in time he was ordained a priest and eventually returned to Ireland and ministered as Parish Priest of New Ross.

The Bishop of Ferns at the time was NICHOLAS FRENCH, who had also escaped to Europe at the same time as Luke. French had been so involved in political events in the 1640s, that there was no chance of his ever returning. He appointed Luke Waddinge as Vicar General to manage the Diocese in his absence. He became Bishop in 1683.

His work was interrupted 1678 by the famous POPISH PLOT, when TITUS OATES claimed that there was another rebellion planned. Anti-Catholic legislation was revived and implemented. All Archbishops, Bishops and Vicars General were to be deported. Luke was arrested but, with help from Protestant friends, managed to avoid deportation. But he was greatly shaken by the experience and began to feel that all he had worked for was at an end.

The reason for the above is to point to a connection between his Christmas of 1678 and ours of 2020. In no way is our

experience on a par with his but he did write a Carol which he names

"ON CHRISTMASS DAY IN THE YEAR 1678. It may echo our own feelings on CHRISTMAS DAY IN THE YEAR 2020!

"This is our Christmas Day, the day of Christ's birth,

Yet we are far from joy and far from Christmas mirth:

On Christmas to have no Mass is our great discontent,

That without Mass this day should pass doth cause us to lament.

The name of Christ – mass must change and altered be,

For since we have no Mass, no Christmas Day have we;

If therefore we do mourn, with grief our hearts are prest,

With tears our eyes do run, our minds and thoughts want rest."

The spellings are his but the sentiments we would share.

There is no comparison between his 1678 Christmas and ours this year but in spite of his dire circumstances he still considered the absence of Mass for the people to be his greatest disappointment.

So, in some small way this bit of history has repeated itself this year but only just!

Recalling the hardship of Catholic life at the time, let's not pity ourselves too much!
