

PASTORAL LETTER



Not from our own tradition, but a litany that has a very powerful resonance when read aloud and responded to, in the Jewish Temple, is the

It's called We Remember Them.

In the rising of the sun and in its going down,

we remember them.

In the blowing of the wind and in the chill of winter,

In the opening of buds and in the rebirth of spring,

This 1st November, I will lead a service of remembrance at the Cathedral in Enniscorthy at 3pm to remember the dead of the Diocese and their grieving friends and families.

am also inviting each priest of the diocese to do so, in his own church, at this time.

Let us set aside this time for prayer and reflection, let us remember those who have died and who grieve, and let us ask God our Father for the resilience and the courage required, as we journey through these trying days.

Ask God for the gift of His embrace for yourself, your loved one(s), and those particularly pained by recent bereavement and the harsh limitations the pandemic imposed and imposes.

"I WILL GO TO THE ALTAR OF GOD, THE GOD OF MY JOY "(Ps 43)

In earlier times these words from Psalm 43 were said by the priest as he approached the foot of the Altar to begin Mass.

An ALTAR is a structure on which offerings were made to the gods to pacify them and to show dependence on them. The offerings took the form of the produce of the land which was burned and animals that were sacrificed. For example Noah built an altar to offer sacrifice in thanksgiving after the flood. The altar then became known as 'THE PLACE OF SACRIFICE".

The Christian Religion is based on the Sacrifice of Jesus on Calvary- said to be on the ALTAR OF THE CROSS. Mass, celebrated on the Church Altar, recalls that Sacrifice and His following Resurrection. Therefore the Altar is the focal and central point in a Church and must not be used for any other purpose other than the celebration of Mass. With the closure of the Augustinian Church, a major concern of the Friars was the future of the beautifully decorated Altar and Reredos. This was the work of the Maddock brothers of Bannow and has served as the point of worship in that Church since 1835.

The Provincial of the Order, Father Hennebry has kindly offered the Altar and Reredos to the Parish and we have gratefully accepted his generous gesture. Our thanks are due also to Father Collender for facilitating the necessary arrangements. The installing of the Altar in the Parish Church meets the following objectives:-

- As the Altar was the focal point of worship in the Friary since 1835, its preservation is now guaranteed, thus enabling it to continue that same sacred function in New Ross into the future.
- It will be a constant reminder of and a fitting memorial to the major contribution of the Augustinian Community to the pastoral and educational needs of New Ross since the 14th century.
- It will mean a lot to those parishioners for whom the Friary was their regular place of worship.
- It will be a fine addition to our exceptionally beautiful Church.
- Our present Altar is showing signs of fatigue and a replacement would most likely have to be considered in the near future.

The REREDOS – that section of an Altar attached to the back wall of a Church - is itself a spectacular piece. It is proposed to erect that in the Adoration Chapel. Plans are in hand for the transfer of both. Suitable plaques will be erected to record the history of the Altar and Reredos and acknowledging the generosity of the Augustinian Order.

"David built an altar to the Lord and offered burnt offerings and a peace offering. Thus the Lord was moved by prayer for the land and the plague was held back from Israel" (2 Samuel 24: 25)

THE AUGUSTINIANS first came to New Ross in the 14th century. With the dissolution of Irish Monasteries in 1540 they lost a large amount of property but they appear to have continued to minister to the people secretly. Their fortunes revived in the 17th century when Father Edmund Healy arrived as Prior. In 1720 Father Joseph Rossiter built a small thatched chapel close to the site of the present Church and convent, work on which was commenced in 1832 when Father James Crane was Prior. I mention these three men as representative of the many and to record our gratitude to unsung heroes unknown and un-remembered Augustinians -who laboured in New Ross over eight centuries.
