LEST WE FORGET.....

- The demand is frequently voiced that control of schools should be removed from the Catholic Church.
- This statement ignores two important facts :-
- 1) the present reality regarding the control of schools.
- 2) the genesis of the Catholic Church's involvement in schools.

1. Schools in Ireland are governed by Education Acts promulgated by the Irish Parliament (The DÁIL). The Department of Education and Skills administers these Acts through Circular Letters, binding on school Boards of Management. Written Agreements between the Department, the Teacher Unions and Management Bodies make for the smooth operation of the day-to-day business of schools. Therefore control of schools does not lie with any individual body



2. The Ireland of the 18th and 19th centuries was governed to a greater or lesser degree by the severity of the Penal Laws. These laws were devised for the sole purpose of keeping our ancestors poor, ignorant and in subjection.

POVERTY was assured by the Law that forbade a father bequeathing his land to his eldest son. Instead he had to divide his holding among all his sons. So, for example, in the case of a family of five sons, it meant that each son ended up five times poorer than his father was.

Catholics were forbidden to organise schools in order to keep them **IGNORANT** education –wise; the mantra being "educate the Irish and they will rule themselves". **SUBJECTION** was maintained by excluding the Irish from any say in the running of their country.

With the relaxation of these Laws, the Catholic Emancipation Act of 1829 and the growth of a Catholic middle class, things began to improve in the areas of health, education and social services.

The Catholic Church was the only organisation on the ground with the structures, the personnel and the Gospel commitment to take on the mammoth task of providing schools, hospitals and social services for a needy nation.

Religious Congregations of Sisters and Brothers were formed to met these needs. People, devoting their lives to a relationship with Jesus, through a radical living of His way of life, giving practical expression to that by dedicating themselves fully to providing these educational, health and social services almost totally from their own resources.

With the gaining of our freedom and the formation of our own State, an impoverished nation continued to depend on the Catholic Church in these areas in the provision of facilities and personnel.

That story has shadows too and serious failures along the way; they must not be air-brushed out but acknowledged and repented of. Blanket condemnations however serve no cause. The good and the bad stand side by side in the narrative.

It is always the obligation of the State to cater for the needs of its citizens. That is what has happened. Once in a position financially to do so the State has rightly assumed that obligation so that today schools, hospitals and social services are governed and supported by the Government.

Religious personnel have all but disappeared from our schools and hospitals. The present generation maybe unaware of the massive contribution made by countless women and men who were happy to give their all for those they served. The Catholic Church will continue faithful to their memory and its mission in contributing to development in all these vital areas of health and education.

If we choose to forget our past we cannot understand our present and will have no future.
