and his kingdom will have no end.

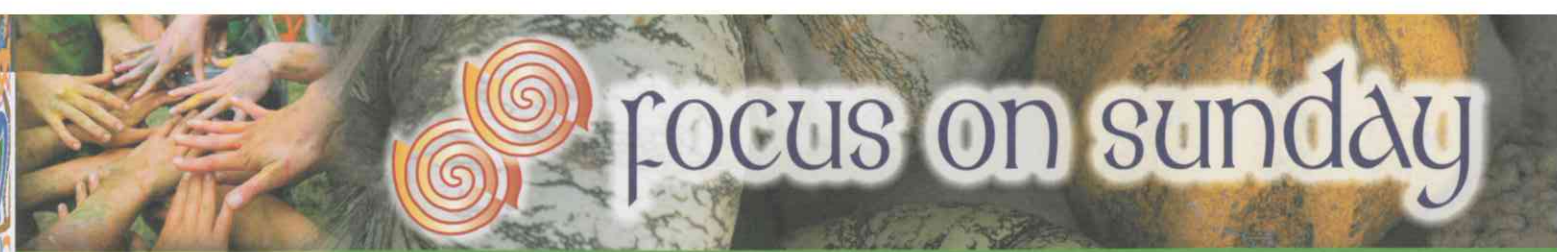
I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord,

A common question to a member of a religious order is often 'did you spend any time out foreign?' The 'foreign missions' were something we were brought up on, and continue today in the wider world of short-term volunteering and NGOs working in areas of health, education and development. Our Sunday today remembers especially those whose mission has brought them away from home in the spread of the gospel.

The missionary in the church has been cleric and lay – religious and lay. We think of the clerics like bishop Galvin, founder of the Columbans, Franciscan Missionary Foundress Mother Kevin and the Legion of Mary envoy, Edel Quinn. These represent so many thousands of men and women who left the homeland of their baptism in the footsteps of Jesus. Many of them were the first to bring health care and education to the developing world, as well as baptism and Christian faith.

The motivation of the missionary comes from their relationship with Jesus. Without that they are NGOs, who also play their role in development. The missionary is answering the call to be a 'missionary disciple', as Mary and the apostles. Pope Francis writes in *The Joy of the Gospel*: Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries", but rather that we are always "missionary disciples".

Lord may your kingdom come on earth as in heaven.
