Part IV

In the year 2000 the Diocese of Ferns celebrated the 14th century anniversary of its founding by St. Aidan. To mark that important milestone the late Father John Gahan produced a major work entitled "THE SECULAR PRIESTS OF THE DIOCESE OF FERNS". The book consists of pen pictures of all the priests who served in the Diocese from the early 19th century to the year 2000.

Over the next number of weeks the Newsletter will carry his accounts of all the Parish Priests and Curates who worked in New Ross Parish during that time.

REV MICHAEL KAVANAGH was born at Scar Castle, Duncormick. He was educated for the priesthood at St. Patrick's College, Maynooth, 1860-1864, and was ordained with Rev. William Moran at St. John's Dublin, on 24th September 1864.

After ordination he was sent to assist hs uncle, Very Rev. William Kavanagh, who was PP Ballymore. On 1st October 1866 he joined the teaching staff of St. Peter's College, where he spent twenty two years, being

President for fifteen years. As President of St. Peter's College, he was responsible for the building of St. Aidan's wing, including a large lecture hall, often referred to as "The Big Study Hall", with dormitories overhead. He also provided a gymnasium and an infirmary.

Fr. Kavanagh was appointed Parish Priest of New Ross on 21st May 1888. From the start he set out to work to erect a church worthy of the town and, on 29th September 1895, the foundation stone of the present church was laid. It was designed by Walter Doolin and took seven years to build. It was opened in 1902 by Bishop Browne, the preacher being Father Conmee, SJ.

During his pastorate several important ecclesiastical buildings were erected in New Ross, e.g., the residence of the Christian Brothers in 1890; the Good Shepherd Convent Chapel and the Irishtown Chapel in 1892; the Mercy Convent National Schools in 1895. He converted the old parish church into a Concert Hall in 1903; and built the presbytery in 1907. The cost of these and other works amounted to over £40,000.00. Canon Kavanagh was appointed Dean of Ferns and Vicar General in 1907. His silver jubilee as pastor was commemorated in 1913. Dean Kavanagh died on 21st November 1915.

The tablet opposite is dedicated to the memory of the Right Rev. Michael Kavanagh (1840-1915), Parish Priest of New Ross and Dean of Ferns, says 'this beautiful church' is 'the enduring monument of his genius and his zeal for the glory of God' of its builder.
