SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (Divine Mercy Sunday) 11th April 2021

Easter for Thomas was a rediscovery of his faith in Jesus.
The risen power of the Lord is the basis for his people's faith.



Thomas was a man who wanted to see before he would believe, and you would not blame him for that. He would want to see the wounds of Christ and touch them, and then he would believe in the risen Lord. He had left the apostles, gone away from the group. Where he went, we do not know but wherever he went he did not find what he wanted, so he came home. He returned to Mary and the apostles, probably still grumpy and unbelieving.

Like many of us when we stray from faith, we find it weaker, and look for a fulness of life elsewhere.

Somehow Jesus came among the apostles. Afraid as they were, they were faithful enough to wait. They believed he had been raised from death. After all he had told them that this would happen.

When he came among them, he sought out Thomas, and he showed him his hands and his side.

It is interesting that nowhere does the gospel say that Thomas actually touched the wounds. He was coming to realise that even though he could see the wounds of Jesus, faith was something more than seeing or touching, and the end of the story was very much directed to him. 'happy are they who have not seen and yet believed'. Those words are not a rebuke but a promise and a grace, that he would know more and more of this man whom he followed and loved as his life went on.

Lord I believe, strengthen my belief.

We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us; this is what loving God is - keeping his commandments; and his commandments are not difficult, because anyone who has been begotten by God has already overcome the world; this is the victory over the world - our faith. Who can overcome the world? Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God; Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only, but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness - since the Spirit is the truth.

GOSPEL John 20: 19 - 31

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit, For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.' Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

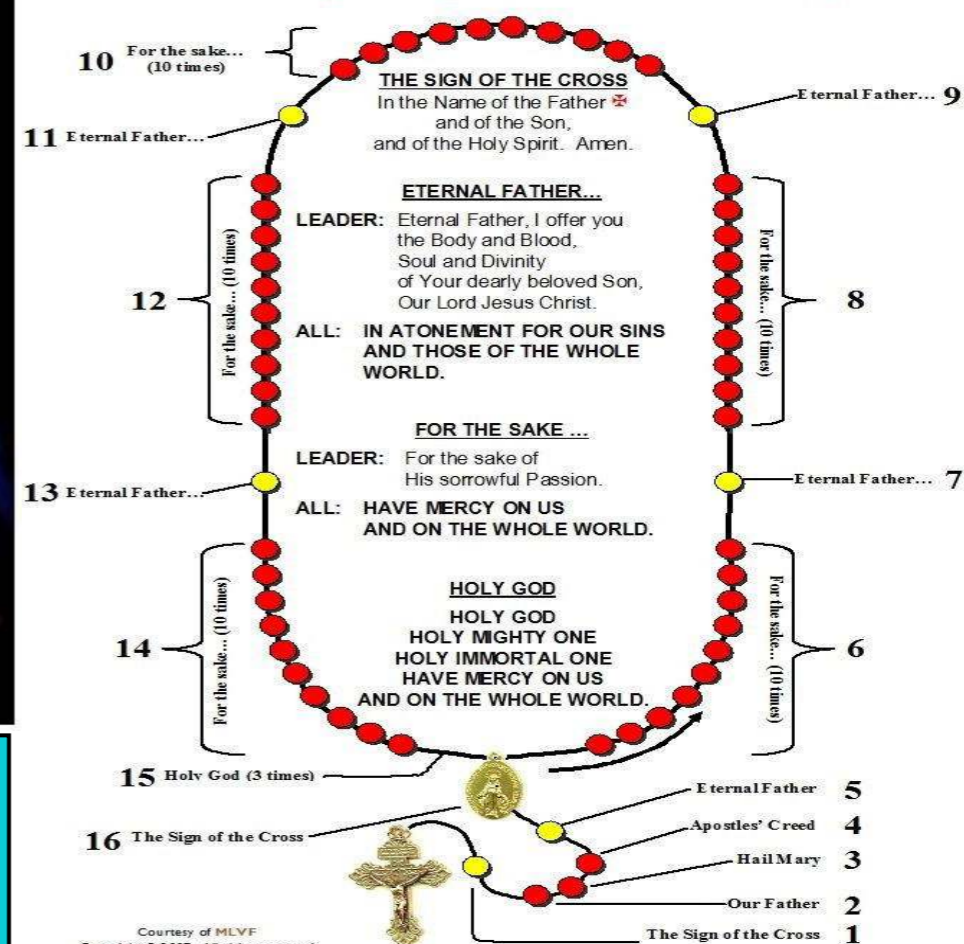
