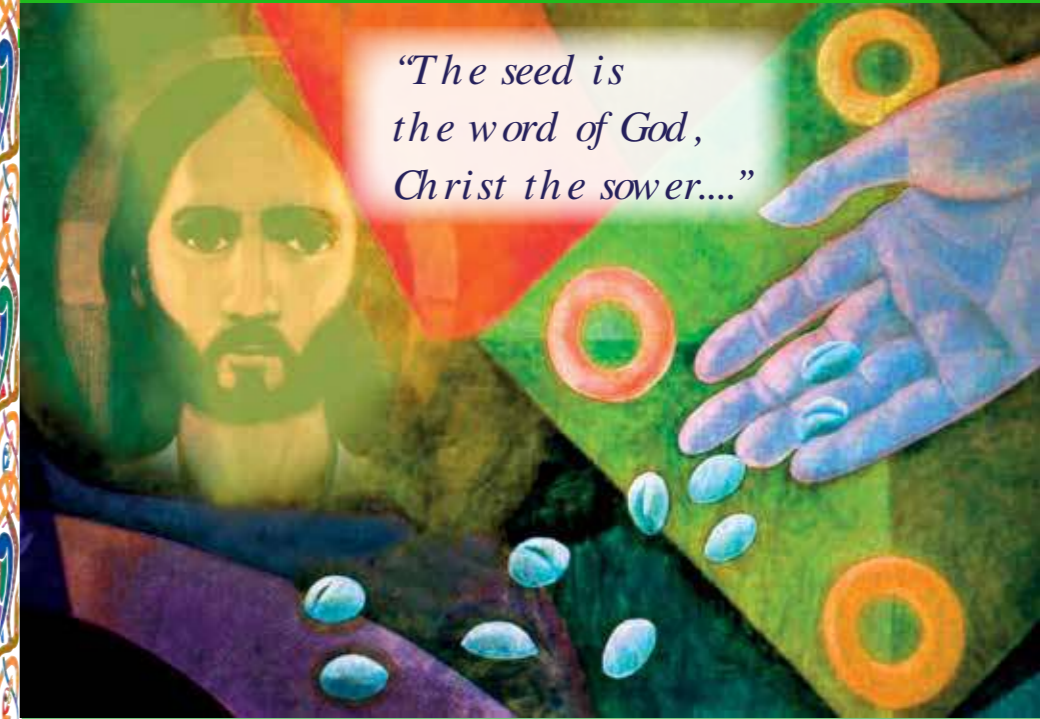


# focus on sunday

because the harvest has come'. He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? NEW ROSS "MEALS ON WHEELS" MAKES AN URGENT APPEAL FOR PEOPLE TO ASSIST ON ITS SERVICE ON A VOLUNTARY BASIS. THE SOCIAL EMPLOYMENT SCHEME HAS PROVIDED SUCH HELP FOR MANY YEARS AND WE ARE MOST GRATEFUL TO ALL THE INDIVIDUALS WHO ASSISTED THE PERMANENT STAFF IN PREPARING AND DELIVERING UPWARDS TO 70 MEALS FIVE DAYS A WEEK. THREE OF THE CURRENT CE SCHEME MEMBERS ARE DUE TO COMPLETE THEIR STINT SHORTLY AND THEY ARE NOT BEING REPLACED AT THE MOMENT. 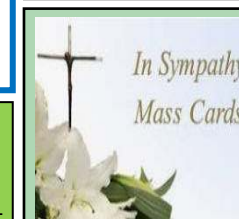
