with him except Peter and James and
John the brother of James. So they came
to the official's house and Jesus noticed
all the commotion, with people weeping
and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in
and said to them, 'Why all this commotion
and crying? The child is not dead, but
asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he
turned them all out and, taking with him
the child's father and mother and his own
companions, he went into the place where
the child lay. And taking the child by the
hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which
means, 'Little girl, I tell you to get up.' The
little girl got up at once and began to walk
about, for she was twelve years old.
At this they were overcome with
astonishment, and he ordered them strictly
not to let anyone know about it, and told
them to give her something to eat.

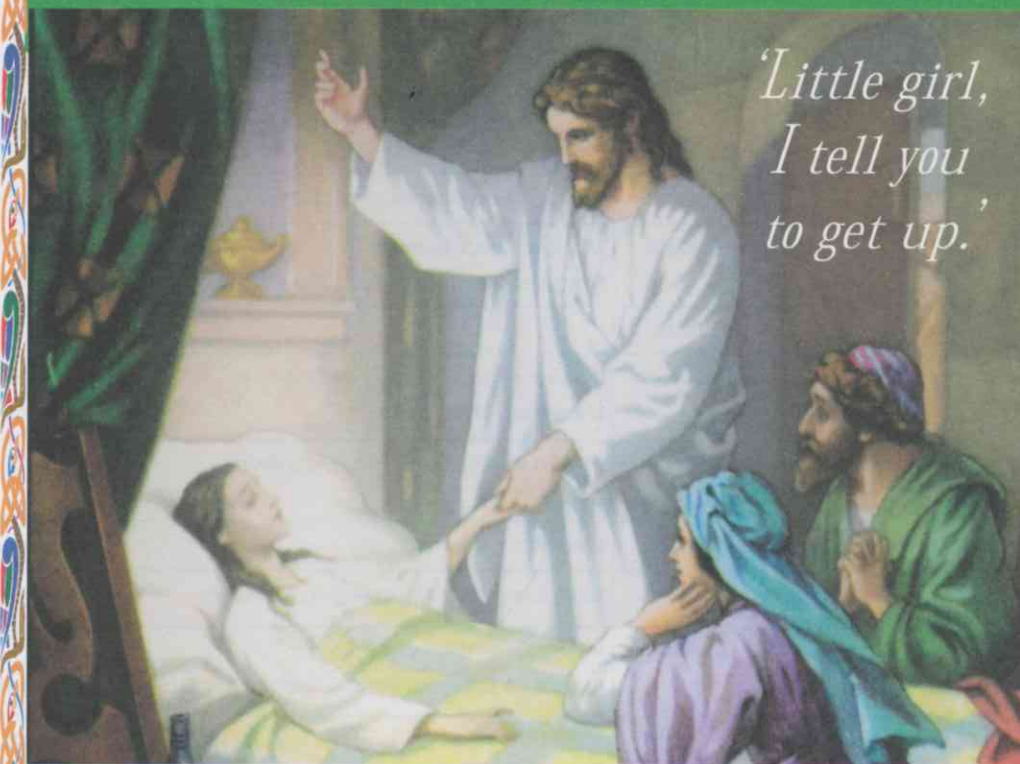

other in ordinary human situations. In the Church we have different views on
many issues like ordination, abortion, sexuality. But we need to continue our
commitment to what the church has been good at for years - care for life, for the
poor, the homeless, and the refugee.

Jairus' little girl was a not a lost cause. Neither is the Church. Our future is in
prayer, in sharing faith together, and living the gospel of Jesus in word and in
how we live.

THE NEWLY REFURBISHED PARISH OFFICE AND SHOP

The official blessing and opening took place on Monday 14th June. The new layout provides us with a larger office and shop, together with two meeting rooms, a storeroom and a kitchenette. We hope you will find the facilities more convenient and we welcome you to visit at your ease. Local historian Jim Sutton writes that this building has played a central role in the history of the town. It was built in 1782 by a Mr. McCormack, who, during the 1798 Battle of Ross, acted as a messenger for General Henry Johnson. It has had a varied history ever since. It functioned as a church and meeting place for various Protestant Groups. The founder of the Methodists John Wesley is recorded to have preached there. It became part of the Tottenham Estate, as was the present site of the Parish Church. The building was semi- derelict in the 1940s/50s when Father Pat Doyle enlisted the help of the youth of the time and the restored the hall for local use. It then became THE LEGION OF MARY HALL, where meetings and social dancing and children's plays took place.

Some years ago, the Parish Office was transferred from the Presbytery to the hall and a shop for religious items was opened.

With an increase in the demand for those services, it was decided some months ago to extend the facilities to take in the whole building. We hope you like the result. Larger meetings will now be held in the hall in Michael Street Pastoral Centre
