# JOGGING MY MEMORY: 'THE MONKS' SCHOOL', NEW ROSS. IN THE 1880S

### Very Rev. Mark Canon O' Byrne

The paucity of amateur entertainments was due to the want of a suitable hall. Concerts, lecture, dances, bazaars etc. Had to be held in the so --called Large Room of the Tholsel. It was only when disused Protestant Church in Robert Street was acquired, choral and dramatic classes began to flourish, though, indeed, that dilapidated structure left much to be desired. Nevertheless, we had many enjoyable nights there, listening to a varied programme of glees, trios, duets and solos by our own celebrities. Their repertoire, to be sure, was not very Classical, but neither were hard to please. The old Ditties, 'Sweet Chiming Bells', 'The Maid of the Mill', 'Good News from Home', 'luanita', 'The Gipsy Maid', Etc., did not sound silly or mid-Victorian in our eyes; if we did not give away to sentimentality, at any rate we observed respectful silence, in the hope that the item would be comic song by John Browne or Jim Crowley, our two outstanding comedians. Their favourite piece included 'Dr Quack', 'Miss Hooligan's Christmas Cake', 'Father O' Flynn', 'Demetrius O' Flanagan McCarthy', etc. And how we did laugh!
