





His mission was to heal and teach, and their non-acceptance would not stop him. He would move on to other towns and villages, often to be despised in them also. Our own acceptance and welcome of his message and love in our lives will lead to great meaning and joy.

#### **REFLECTION**

WILLIAM ARTHUR WARD was an American motivational writer and speaker. He produced many uplifting and insightful comments. For example talking about three sailors having trouble in a difficult wind- the PESSIMIST among them just sat there and saw no hope; the OPTIMIST lay back comfortably expecting things to improve and the REALIST did something .he adjusted the sails to meet their situation.

In another context he suggested the following approach to life

DO MORE THAN BELONG—PARTICIPATE

DO MORE THAN CARE—---HELP

DO MORE THAN BELIEVE---PRACTISE

As regards our reflection to night, he described teachers as follows

He wrote:-

The MEDIOCRE teacher---tells

The GOOD teacher.....explains
The GREAT teacher.....demonstrates

The EXCELLENT teacher...inspires.

JESUS CHRIST was the teacher par excellence. He inspired total strangers to follow Him and others to leave everything to be His special friends.

He also employed a very basic principle of teaching – you go from what you know to what you don't know. In other words you build on the experience of the audience. He always pitched His teachings within the daily experience of His hearers.

For example when getting across the difference He would make to their lives, He suggested the contrast between LIGHT and DARKNESS.

They appreciated that difference far more readily than we would today. We are seldom in total darkness, though we can appreciate how helpless we are in an electrical outage. Even in those circumstances we have solar and battery light. So we seldom if ever experience total darkness.

In those times, the day began and ended with the rising and the setting of the sun. They knew well how helpless and vulnerable they were in the darkness. Into that experience He announced I AM THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD. He proceeded then to show them HOW by His life style. Even His enemies were forced to admit that "HE WENT AROUND DOING GOOD." The hungry were fed, the sick healed and the poor were given shown respect and dignity and given hope and help.

There was a lot of darkness in lives then (as now) in the form of sickness, poverty, disrespect, greed, selfishness and a lack of dignity and freedom. His presence, His words and His actions lifted that darkness and brightened lives.

You might say His light is struggling in our world to lift the darkness of sick minds, destructive words and evil deeds. We - His present day followers must ask ourselves - are we doing enough to shed His light into the dark areas of our own lives and of society. We must begin with ourselves. We cannot give what we have not got. His good news story was given flesh through his deeds.

After a shaky start His early followers realised the power of His word and gave their lives in introducing others to His life-giving gift.

BASIL HUME was an unknown Benedictine monk in an English monastery. In 1976 he was the surprise choice as Archbishop of Westminster and Cardinal. He frequently told a story of an experience he had on a trip to Ethiopia during a terrible famine in 1984. He was taken by helicopter to a mountain village. As soon as he landed a little boy ran up

and took hold of his hand and never let it go for the duration of the visit. The child never spoke but he did two simple things each time they met a group on their way through the village.

He raised his free to ask for food and with the other he raised the Cardinal's hand to rub against his own face. The Cardinal never tired of telling that in those two simple gestures the boy showed that the human being's two greatest needs are FOOD and LOVE. The provision of both sums up the essentials of the Christian religion.

MAHATMA GANDHI was an admirer of Jesus Christ and held His teachings in high regard. However his assessment of their influence Is interesting and should give us cause to examine how faithful we are in living them. He stated that CHRISTIANITY HASN'T FAILED, IT SIMPLY HAS NEVER BEEN TRIED SERIOUSLY.

Today people are attracted by what they see in action rather than by what they hear in words. They follow witnesses rather than preachers. There can be no contradiction between words and actions.

Both must shed His light on the darkness of our world, for He is the Light of the World....WHOEVER FOLLOWS ME WILL NEVER WALK I DARKNESS BUT WILL HAVE THE LIGHT OF LIFE

He made that statement in the context of the woman, whose life style placed her in danger of losing her life by stoning. Jesus knew the law in this regard. So did the woman, as did the people who dragged her to Him for comment. They stoutly reminded Him of the legal situation. But He neatly boxed out of the corner in which the accusers of the woman through they had trapped, by calmly invited anyone among them without sin to throw the first stone. In fact the only one present who was without sin and therefore entitled to throw a stone, was Himself.

Since no one in the group could meet that standard, the Gospel says that when Jesus stood up and asked innocently "HAS NO ONE CONDEMNED YOU?"- He assured her He would not be throwing any stones or condemning her either and suggested that she change her life style. It was at this point that He declared I AM THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD. He wanted His followers to know that they didn't have to live in darkness, hopelessness or captives to sin. If they follow Him, He would bring His "light of life" into their lives and change them by His power.

In the words of Saint John Henry Newman we pray "Lead kindly light..."
