Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown. She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. Then a second sign appeared in the sky, a huge red dragon which had seven heads and ten horns, and each of the seven heads crowned with a coronet. Its tail dragged a third of the stars from the sky and dropped them to the earth, and the dragon stopped in front of the woman as she was having the child, so that he could eat it as soon as it was born from its mother. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled. 'And Mary said:

'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit exults in God my saviour; because he has looked upon his lowly handmaid. It is of the Assumption. Mary was the perfect combination of our humanity cooperating with the Divine - in her very body she became the first tabernacle. Like the prayer that bears her name "Hail Mary" it combines the words (Hail Mary, full of grace...) of the Angelic visitor to Nazareth and our human words (Holy Mary, Mother of God) in response. May we like her cooperate more fully with God's loving plan.

Jesus' Story

Today's feast is about the glory of death. We wonder much about what happens after death. What will we be like, will we recognise each other? Jesus says little about the details of the afterlife except that he goes to prepare us a place, and we will enjoy eternal life. The feast of Mary's Assumption throws some light on the mystery of death. We believe that she is body and soul in heaven. This means that she is totally there, knowing God and her son fully. The focus of her earthly life was her son – not in a way of always talking about him, but of being totally faithful to him and his father.

Our Lady's Island Pilgrimage



The traditional pilgrimage season for Lady's Island begins Sunday 15th August and continues until the 8th September.

This year, because of Covid regulations, all services will be held in the Church, with restricted numbers.

Visitors are still welcome to come on pilgrimage and walk the Island with the usual catering and Gift Shop facilities still available.

All services will be broadcast on line and on local radio 106FM. From the 15th daily masses will be at 3pm and 8pm.

At the Opening Mass on the Sunday 15th August @3.00pm our retiring Bishop Denis Brennan will bid his farewell and our new Bishop Elect Monsignor Ger Nash will introduce himself to the people of our Diocese.

A variety of musicians and speakers have been invited each week with many parishes having their own smaller gatherings.

16th AUGUST BROADCAST 2

We began last week with "The Hook". We move a little up the coast now to Our Lady's Island, where the annual pilgrimage season began yesterday- curtailed naturally by Covid 19 restrictions. This site has been a place of pilgrimage since the 3rd Crusaderoughly around the time of the building of the Hook Lighthouse. It has been said that at the close of the pilgrimage season in Lough Derg, the pilgrims made their way to Our Lady's Island for the commencement of the season there on the 15th August. We mentioned Our Lady's pattern of life by followed two paths- SERVICE AND SILENCE.

Our Lady's Island is the ideal location for reflecting on Her life and seeing how her example is so necessary to our lives today. The island is free from the commercialism so obvious in most Marian Shrines. An early morning or late evening walk around the island provides that essential peace and quiet for reflection, especially in these strange

We have come through a destructive period boom and bust and are now in between recovery from or facing into the uncertainty of another bout of Covid 19.

Maybe covid has given us cause for thought. Some values were getting a foothold in our society that were founded on shifting sands and in danger of replacing more tradition and Christian standards. We worked seven days and shopped till we dropped. To a large degree we forgot what we needed in favour of what we wanted.

Maybe God stepped in to bust our boom and showed us through the virus that we are not independent We were losing the run of ourselves but now we have been forced to pause and catch our breath.

A recent Sunday's Gospel mirrored our situation. The Disciples had returned from their first mission journey and were full of enthusiasm after the experience. So busy they had no time even to eat. Their success amazed them and they felt all-powerful- ready to go

Jesus put a damper on that enthusiasm by saying COME AWAY TO A QUIET PLACE AND REST A WHILE.

He says the same to us in these troublesome times. He offers His mother as our guide. She is the great example of reflecting on situations and allowing them to influence her reactions. Pope St John Paul 11 said CONTEMPLATING THE SCENES OF THE ROSARY IN UNION WITH MARY IS A MEANS OF LEARNING FROM HER TO READ THE FACE OF JESUS, TO DISCOVER HIS SECRETS AND UNDERSTAND HIS MESSAGE.

At the Annunciation we are told SHE CONSIDERED IN HER MIND what had been revealed to her.

At the Birth of Jesus, MARY KEPT ALL THESE THING, PONDERING THEN IN HER **HFART**

At the Presentation in the Temple SHE MARVELLED AT WHAT HAD BEEN SAID ABOUT HIM.

At the FINDING IN THE TEMPLE again SHE KEPT ALL THESE THINGS IN HER HEART.

All in order that SHE WOULD LIVE ACCORDING TO HIS WORD

When we reflect on God's Word, we begin to develop His way of thinking, absorb His values and live according to His standards.

Reflection leads to interiorisation of His message so that we live a life like His .St. Paul said I LIVE NOW NOT I BUT CHRIST LIVES IN ME. To live in friendship with Him and in service of others. That is our goal.

Jesus did just that at the Last Supper. He prayed with His disciples and then washed their feet., saying I HAVE GIVEN YOU AN EXAMPLE.

DO TO OTHERS AS I HAVE DONE TO YOU. Mary and the saints all based their lives on this pattern and are our exemplars.

St. Ignatius of Loyola was born in Spain at the end of the 16th century into a large, semi-noble family, with all the privileges that went with that.

His aim in life was to follow the family tradition- TO DO GREAT THINGS FOR THE KING AND FOR HIMSELF. He was seriously injured in a battle against the French. During a long recovery in a place called MANRESA, he happened by chance to read the life of Jesus and decided that for the rest of his life he would do great things for God, instead for King or himself. He founded the Society of Jesus- the Jesuits- with a motto which says EVERYTHING FOR THE GREATER GLORY OF GOD. The name MANRESA is used on many of their houses of reflection and prayer- in memory of Ignatius' conversion. He once said TO FALL IN LOVE WITH GOD IS THE GREATEST ROMANCE.

TO SEEK HIM IS THE GREATEST ADVENTURE: TO FIND HIM IS THE GREATEST HUMAN ACHIEVEMENT.

Pope Francis, himself a Jesuit, tells us that THE JOY OF THE GOSPEL FILLS THE LIVES AND HEARTS OF ALL WHO HAVE MET JESUS.

SO we need not just to know about Him but we need to get to know Him as a real, live, fascinating ,personal friend. As the song says- a FOREVER FRIEND ,FROM DARKEST NIGHT TO RAINBOW'S END. He will offer to walk with us each day. We will only develop such a close friendship if we spend time with Him. He said to the woman at the well IF YOU ONLY KNEW THE GIFT GOD IS OFFERING YOU. That is the gift He is offering to each of us. Mary whispers in our ears DO WHAT EVER HE TELLS YOU.
