

16th AUGUST- BROADCAST 3

In this final section I suggest some simple ways of getting to know Jesus so that He becomes a daily part of our lives. To get to know someone; to form a friendship, to develop a skill, to form a habit TIME is the first thing we have to devote to the project. There is no substitute for time spent. The same applies if we want a close friendship with Jesus- to spend time silently in His company.



But He needs to get to know us. Was there ever a more chilling, desperate plea for company when in the Agony in the Garden, He cried out- CAN YOU NOT WATCH ONE HOUR WITH ME? His pain was added to by the failure of His friends to stay with Him. He was deserted long before He was betrayed by Judas and denied by Peter.

We don't find it easy to sit silently anywhere. The French Philosopher PASCHAL Wrote---ALL THE TROUBLES IN THE WORLD ARE CAUSED BY THE INABILITY OF PEOPLE TO SIT SILENTLY IN A ROOM FOR ANY LENGTH OF TIME. I suggest the following three scenes from the Gospel to use on a visit to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament or just sitting with Him in some quiet spot:

- The Agony in the Garden
- The woman at the well
- The woman taken in adultery.

Picture their scene in your mind, see yourself there, listening, watching, responding to the conversations.

A) Let's imagine we are in the Garden of Getsemani and we hear the same call from Jesus CAN YOU WATCH ONE HOUR WITH ME? The same Jesus is present. An Atheist said if I could believe that I would never leave this building. Just sit silently- in sympathy, in awe, in thanksgiving. Resist the temptation to ask for anything. An old man was asked what he did all the time he spends in the church. He said I LOOK AT HIM AND HE LOOKS AT ME. SILENCE among friends is communication/ silence among strangers is embarrassing.

B) Imagine the meeting of Jesus with the Samaritan woman at the well. By all the rules of the time neither should have spoken to the other. Yet Jesus was so free in Himself that He was never cowed down or limited by shallow, social restrictions. He ask her for a drink of water and then offered her His life-giving grace. He offers that invitation to us too. Meeting Him changed her life. This woman is our hope and our guide. Unable to keep it to herself she immediately ran back to tell her neighbours of her good fortune. Meeting Him will change our lives too.

C) Woman accused of adultery.



Rembrant's paintings are noted for his use of light and colour but also by the reduced size of the human characters in inserts into his pictures. His painting of this scene departs from this custom. The figure of Jesus is exaggerated in comparison to the other characters in the picture It is the

artist's way of showing that Jesus is morally superior to those trying to trick Him. The Law is clear. They have lobbed a granade into His lap. If He agrees that the law should take its course, He will be accused of departing from His well-known compassionate attitude to wrong doers. If He suggests the law should be set aside. He will be accused of advocating rebellion.

Solomon was presented with a similar dilemma previously.

But there is a greater than Solomon here- as Scripture says.

Jesus defly lobs the granade back to them, saying FINE, LET THE ONE AMONG YOU WITH NO SIN CAST THE FIRST STONE.

Let us reflect on where we might stand in this situation. There are three roles illustrated here. Which do we fill?

* That of the self-righteous religious leaders- when we judge and condemn those who fail to reach the heights of our moral standards, while continuing to fail ourselves.

* That of the woman in her situation- in our own weaknesses when we seek understanding, acceptance, support, forgiveness and hope for a future and a new beginning.

* That of Jesus- acknowledges her fault but refuses to condemn, gives her hope, restores her dignity and gives her her place again in society. Everything He offers her, He offers to us too/

Everything He offers us, we must offer to others.
