
GOSPEL Mark 13:24-32




'Very often the poor hear voices scolding them, telling them to be quiet and to put up with their lot. These voices are harsh, often due to fear of the poor, who are considered not only destitute but also a source of insecurity and unrest, an unwelcome distraction from life as usual and needing to be rejected and kept afar. We tend to create a distance between the poor and the rich, without realising that in this way we are distancing ourselves from the Lord Jesus, who does not reject the poor, but calls them to himself and comforts them.'

Psalm 33 says - 'the Lord hears the cry of the poor'. It is through our ears and hearts that the crv is heard. For Pope Francis the poor are: those whose 'hearts are broken by sadness, loneliness and exclusion; those persecuted in the name of a false justice, oppressed by policies unworthy of the name. They are terrified by violence, yet know that God is their Saviour and who, trampled in their dignity, still find the strength to look up to God for light and comfort.'

NATIONAL MEMORIAL MASS SUNDAY 14TH NOVEMBER

The Bishops of Ireland will undertake a pilgrimage to Knock Shrine this November and celebrate the National Memorial Mass in memory of all who died on the island during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Covid-19 pandemic has been a particularly challenging time for those who have lost loved ones and have often had to cope with their grief without many of the usual spiritual and community supports.

To pastorally support everyone who has suffered the pain of bereavement during the pandemic, and in the context of the month of November as the traditional time when we remember our dead, on next Sunday 14th November at 3.00pm, the Bishops of Ireland will undertake a pilgrimage to the International Eucharistic and Marian Shrine in Knock. The bishops will concelebrate Mass for all those who have died in our country during the pandemic, and for their families. At the Mass the bishops will also offer prayers of thanksgiving for all those who so selflessly sacrificed so much during the pandemic.

This Mass will be live-streamed on <u>www.knockshrine.ie</u> and broadcast on the RTÉ News Now digital television channel and online.

The bishops invite everyone to join with them in prayer on this solemn occasion. Bishop Ger is preaching at a Service of Remembrance in St Iberius Church, Wexford on Sunday, 14th November and he has asked me to represent him in Knock at the Memorial Mass.

In the world you will have trouble,

Creator God, our life is a gift from you, help us to realise that what we do with it is our gift back to you. Today we the People of Ireland remember those who lived and died through World War One.
