‘WHY SHOULD I GO TO MASS ON SUNDAY?’
Extract from Hook of Faith

1. IT IS JESUS HIMSELF WHO INVITES US TO MASS

The most fundamental reason to come to Mass is that Jesus is inviting each of us. In St Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians he writes that Jesus:

On the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, “This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me. (1 Cor 11:23-24)

2. AT MASS OUR FAITH AND FRIENDSHIP WITH JESUS DEEPENS AND GROWS

The much-loved Catholic author, J.R.R. Tolkien said “The only cure for sagging or fainting faith is Communion.” This word, Communion, means union with Christ, specifically in the Eucharist. Because Jesus is truly present at the Mass, this is where we go to form and deepen our faith and friendship with Christ.

3. BECAUSE VIRTUAL IS NO REPLACEMENT FOR THE REAL THING

Live-streamed Masses have been a blessing for many people during the Covid-19 pandemic, and continue to nourish the faith of those who are simply unable to attend in person. In ordinary circumstances, however, virtual Masses are no substitute for being physically present. We all know from the experience of being separated from our loved ones that meeting on a screen is not the same as being together in the same place.

4. BECAUSE GOING TO MASS HELPS US GROW IN FAITH

Some people worry they aren’t holy enough to go Mass; some think they don’t need Mass to be holy. But there is an old saying: ‘the Church is a hospital for sinners, not a club for saints.’ If the Church is a hospital, the Mass is her medicine.

5. BECAUSE GOING TO MASS DEEPENS OUR SENSE OF MISSION

Mission is at the heart of the Mass. The English word ‘Mass’ is missa in Latin, which comes from missio, meaning ‘mission’ or ‘sending’. After we have received the Lord and have given thanks, we are blessed and sent on mission to live and proclaim the Good News.

We the priests of the parish welcome everyone back to the Parish Church.
