

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT - 13th March 2022

The gift of God's love and the following of Jesus is offered to all of us by God. It is a gift we struggle with, as evil in the world tempts us to live in Selfishness. Lent, and today's gospel, reminds us of the glory of our calling to follow in Jesus' ways.





The transfiguration of Jesus shows him in glory and at his best. In showing his glory he speaks of his coming death and resurrection when he will show the greatest love we know.

The question can be asked – how can his body today – the body that we all are - be transfigured? How can we be the type of body that God our Father wants, as he shows us in the Transfiguration the body of his Son.

One phrase which sums up the purpose of the Synod is; "To dream about the church we are called to be, to make hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore strength to our hands for the common mission" (Synod Preparatory Document).
