

Everyone is my neighbour; everyone is a brother and sister in Christ. And that makes a change in how we treat each other.

Or does it?





The universally loved parable of the Good Samaritan teaches us that everyone without exception is our neighbour. When black people began to move in to a white neighbourhood in an American city and started frequenting the local parish church, some wealthy white families took their worship to a church

that was farther away and one hundred percent white. Those who moved were deemed to be good Catholics and generous with their time, talents and financial resources. They just didn't want to be in the same church building as black people. Prejudice runs deep.

Who is my neighbour? Anybody at all who is in need of help. My car battery died one evening in a lonely place on a country road and I was very anxious until someone with a battery pack came along and helped me. "My battery died one time," he said, "and ever since then I carry a battery pack so as to help others." When the Good Samaritan saw the man lying beaten and half dead on the roadside he felt a surge of compassion for him. Compassion for someone in need is a healthy reaction. It puts us in touch with our own humanity and reminds us of our own vulnerability. Time and again Jesus felt compassion for people who were in distress. When I see someone in distress I slow down and imagine myself in their shoes. That gets me up and running to help them.

The Good Samaritan felt compassion towards the person who had been beaten and left for dead. He was able to put himself in the victim's position and feel his pain. That's a healthy human reaction but it's not something that comes easily to everyone. We can choose to ignore someone in trouble, assume they are capable of dealing with their plight without our help. When we act like that we are not in touch with ourselves. St. Bernard of Clairvaux said that self-knowledge, awareness of one's own limitations, weakness and faintheartedness leads one to have compassion for another. Jesus was the great man of compassion. He was also the one who was beaten and left for dead.



### "My journey as a Seminarian"

I come from a very Catholic family in the South of Dublin a place called Inchicore. I served mass in the Oblates Mary Immaculate Church. I always felt the calling from an early age.

At 15 years of age, I met my wife Antoinette she was just 14 years old. We got married when she was 19 and I was just turned 21. We were very

happily married until my wife passed away on August the 11th 2015, I have four children three boys and one girl and proud grandfather to 7 grandchildren.

I worked in Inchicore railway works for 38 years as a tradesman supervisor eventually manager, I was asked to transfer to Houston station as manager of maintenance in 2007 and spent another five years there. I retired in 2012 to care for my wife Antoinette who was ill.

During my life I had always kept in touch with the Oblate Fathers in Inchicore helping them with the sale of work for their Lourdes Pilgrimage, I also worked in the baths in Lourdes for 20 years while also helping with the torch light procession and the sick, I go to Knock a couple of times a year and I feel Our Lady is nurturing. As I have a great

I was a member of the CIE welfare which entailed visiting the sick in hospitals and nursing homes once a week for 40 years approximately, my role was to assist their needs I also help organize an annual outing for 400 to 500 CIE pensioners once a year, being involved with all the organizations I feel it was the start of my calling, I tried to ignore it but it would not go away, There were occasions when I was getting a clear sign, e.g. while talking to people they said I should become a priest completely out of context and on another occasion while at a funeral in the West of Ireland a priest walked up to me and asked did I ever think of becoming a priest which my reply was no, I became very friendly with that same priest and it was him I confided in. I told him what was happening me and he said I believe you have a calling, but you must make the call the light bulb moment came when he said if you're waiting for a letter in the post, you will be left waiting. He asked me would I like to go for the Killala Diocese which I said no, and he got me the name of the vocation's director of the Diocese of Ferns Father Billy Swan.

I am now in my third year studying for the priesthood in the Beda College in Rome where I have just completed two years of philosophy while also studying Canon law Patristic theology, pastrol theology, moral theology, human life, human development, psalms and wisdom, fathers and heritors, Islam, and Muslim culture. I would have to say it was a big change for me and challenging especially not being in school since 14 years of age, there are times when I feel that I am too old but it passes very quickly I believe that I am on the right journey and God willing I will be able to come back to the Diocese of Ferns and served the people with love humanity and kindness. I ask you all to kindly keep me in your prayers as I continue my journey. Thank you all very much for your warm welcome that I have received in New Ross.
