is hidden with Christ in God. But when

desires and especially greed, which is
the same thing as worshipping a false
god; and never tell each other lies. You
have stripped off your old behaviour with

there is no room for distinction between
Greek and Jew, between the circumcised
or the uncircumcised, or between
barbarian and Scythian, slave and free
man. There is only Christ: he is everything
and he is in everything.

of God.'

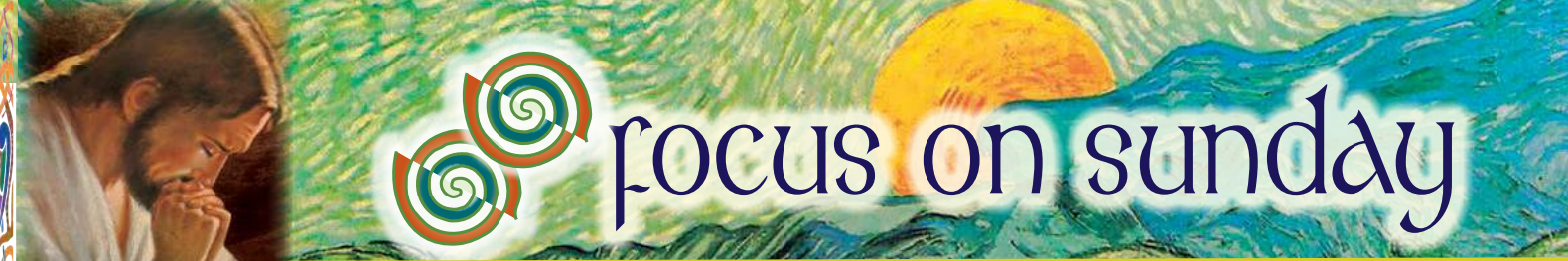
