Jesus needed disciples to do some of the heavy lifting and evangelize the people living along the road that lay ahead. "I am sending you like lambs among wolves," he warns them. He himself was the lamb of God whose death and resurrection would break the back of sin and injustice. He asks them to

take nothing except the promise that he would be with them. This was how the mission of the church began. This is what church is all about: leading people to Jesus Christ. It's the heart of our faith. We are called not to hide our beliefs or keep them in low key, but to share with others the hope and joy of the Gospel.

Many hands make work both light and joyful. It's easier and more fun for two pairs of hands than just one to share food and clothing to the needy. The solitude and loneliness of the long distance runner can be an obstacle in itself and a burden to anyone trying to alleviate the pain of others. Pope Francis often refers to the church as a field hospital. There's no end to the work or healing, ministering and preaching.

"Ask the lord of the harvest to send out labourers." Some 83 million hungry and frightened people are wandering the face of the earth in hopes of finding a welcome. People who are generous with their time and talents are needed to step up and help address this critical mass. What's needed are hearts marked by grace, souls imbued with love. In forming people to bring the Gospel to the unchurched, the lighting of a fire in them is more important than filling them up with theology and giving them degrees.

"Being Church means that we are to be God's leaven in the midst of humanity. It means proclaiming and bringing God's salvation into our world, which so often goes astray and needs to be encouraged, given hope and strengthened on the way. The Church must be a place of mercy, where everyone feels welcome, loved, forgiven and encouraged to live the good life of the Gospel" -Pope Francis, The Joy of the Gospel, para 114.

FROM THE ARCHIEVES - EDUCATION IN NEW ROSS

As our two Primary Schools close this week for the summer holidays, we acknowledge all the good work achieved during the year and before with the return from the experience of Covid and all

that involved. We wish teachers and pupils a very happy and healthy summer

Education and schools in the New Ross of the 17th century paint a very different picture. What follows is an extract from an article by Celestine Murphy on a former Bishop of Ferns and Parish Priest of New Ross, which describes the struggles engaged in, in providing education for people, who are our own ancestors.

The Bishop of Ferns at this time was Nicholas French, who, like Waddinge, had gone into exile in 1651. He had been so involved in the political events of the 1640s that there was no hope of his returning to Ireland. Therefore in 1668 he appointed Waddinge Vicar-General of Ferns diocese. Waddinge had by this time returned to Ireland and had settled in New Ross as parish priest. After years of experiencing rigorous continental Catholicism, Waddinge's return to Wexford must have been a tremendous shock to him. The modest gains made during the Confederate years in implementing the structures of Tridentine Catholicism had been eroded during the Cromwellian settlement. Mass was once again celebrated covertly. Catechetical instruction was rare and the administration of the sacraments intermittent. Those who had remained loyal to the faith were inadequately catered for and many had lapsed into superstition. Others, lacking the constant attention of a diligent clergy and the familiarity of religious practice had drifted away. Waddinge's mission was clear and he set himself to the task of rebuilding the catholic community.

His engaging personality quickly won him a valuable friend and ally in Stephen Gelosse, a Jesuit priest of Belgian extraction, who resided in New Ross. From Gelosse, Waddinge learned an important lesson in survival in an unfavourable political climate. In 1660, Gelosse, together with another Jesuit, Stephen Rice, opened a school for 120 boys in New Ross. Of the 120 boys, thirty-five were boarders; 18 catholics and 17 protestants. Gelosse trained his students to perform moral and religious drama for public audiences. 'For ten years', he informed Rome 'we amused and instructed the people by plays'. The Jesuit were periodically arrested and threatened but managed to maintain the school through the support of liberal protestants in the town.

On one occasion Rice was accused of contravening statutes forbidding catholics to teach. When he appeared in court he pleaded that his school was not fee-paying and, as the law referred to fees, he had not committed an offence. This piece of jesuitry so perplexed the judge that he dismissed the case but ordered Rice not to teach. Rice closed the school for three days, then relying on the support of local protestants, he resumed classes. In 1668 Gelosse and Rice were ordered to appear before the Protestant Archbishop's Court in Dublin. Gelosse attended, was forbidden to teach and complied for two months. Rice refused to go, saying that he was on bail and could not leave the jurisdiction of New Ross court. He taught the boys himself and then, assuming the role of headmaster, he asked Gelosse to return as his assistant. The school went from strength to strength and a third Jesuit teacher joined the staff.
