Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

World Day of the Poor

The Mass today reminds us that in all despair and evils of life,

the resurrection of Christ is a saving promise.

Nothing can shake the certainty that Jesus has been raised

and that God's goodness can overcome every injustice and evil.

his poverty [we] might become rich (2 Cor 8:9). These are the words Pope Francis asks us to reflect on for this sixth World Day of the Poor. In this year when the economic shocks of pandemics, lockdowns and now the Russian invasion of Ukraine have forced more people into poverty

the Pope reminds us, in solidarity with Christ, to "make charity, faith and hope the basis of our lives and our actions" (Message for the sixth World Day of the Poor pub. 13th June 2022)

Why should we open our hearts to the poor? Why not just get on with our lives, look after ourselves famously just ignore the others? It's what we do in many ways. The Pope highlights the cry of the poor each year on this Sunday. It is because of our family bond with God that we care "for those who are least, those whom society discards" (Evangelii Gaudium, 195). We care because the principal care of Jesus was for the poor. In Jesus God suffers with and for the poor, and through us all, wants to better their lot.

"Scripture constantly speaks of God acting on behalf of the poor. He is the one who "hears" their "cry" and "comes to their aid"; he "protects" and "defends" them; he "rescues" and "saves" them... Indeed, the poor will never find God indifferent or silent in the face of their plea. God is the one who renders justice and does not forget (cf. Ps 40:18; 70:6); he is their refuge, and he never fails to come to their assistance (cf. Ps 10:14).' Letter of Pope Francis for this day in 2019.

God acts today through his people. He wants equality of opportunity and of the plenty of the world for all. Again the Pope's letter for 2019: 'The God that Jesus came to reveal is a Father who is generous, merciful, unfailing in his goodness and grace. He gives hope especially to those who are disillusioned and lacking in hope for the future.' Only in the efforts in love of all of us, church and state can this become reality. "It is not talk that matters; what matters is rolling up our sleeves and putting our faith into practice through a direct involvement" (Letter



NOVEMBER REFLECTION 2

It is clear from the Gospels that Jesus had a number of close friends to whom He went when He needed a rest from travelling the dusty country; to get away from the crowds or make important plans.

Of course, His closest friend was His Heavenly Father- THE FATHER AND I ARE ONE. He often escaped to the hills to pray, especially before any important decision or upcoming anxious event- for example the Agony in the Garden. Before He chose the twelve Apostles, we are told He spent the whole night in prayer.

His earthly friends were vital to Him too. We often forget that He was fully human- in need of human support and companionship. Remember the night of His arrest, in His agony, He clearly show that need when He said to those He had especially chosen- "COULD YOU NOT WATCH ONE HOUR WITH ME?

One family and their home appeared to hold a special place in His life-that of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. It seems they were so familiar, that they took Him as one of themselves and treated Him accordingly. The evidence of this special relationship is in St. John's Gospel. Lazarus becomes ill, so much so that the family immediately sent a message to Jesus. There was no request that He come and work a miracle. The message simply said THE ONE YOU LOVE IS SICK. But the clear expectation was that He would come in a hurry. But He didn't. We maybe shocked at that, but they were shocked and disappointed even more. Did He not care about "the one He loved?"

When Jesus finally arrives at their house, Lazarus was dead and buried.

Its our turn now to be shocked at Martha's reaction to His late arrival.

She didn't spare Him but bluntly told Him to His face what she thought of Him- "IF YOU HAD BEEN HERE MY BROTHER WOULD NOT HAVE DIED."

No mention now of "the one you loved"; it is now very definitely MY BROTHER they are talking about. But Jesus calmly reminds her of what she already believes- that death is not the end-YOUR BROTHER WILL RISE AGAIN. She confirms her faith in the resurrection I KNOW HE WILL RISE AGAIN AT THE RESURRECTION ON THE LAST DAY.

Then Jesus makes the startling claim I AM THE RESURRECTION.

And He goes even further ANYONE WHO BELIEVES IN ME, EVEN THOUGH HE DIES HE WILL LIVE AND WHO EVER LIVES AND BELIEVES IN ME WILL NEVER DIE.

FAITH can be tested or shaken or even rejected in the face of a bereavement. Even someone like Martha appeared to have her faith in Jesus undermined.

Whatever the reaction to the loss through death, where else in life do we look for meaning

The Resurrection is our only solid source of hope. St. Paul says it bluntly-IF JESUS IS NOT RISEN FROM THE DEAD, OUR FAITH IS USELESS.

THE RISEN CHRIST is central and in two ways—for the deceased and for those who mourn.

God has guaranteed eternal life to those who love Him. He made us to know, love and serve Him in this life and to be happy with Him forever in the next. That guarantee is copper fastened by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Scripture says" Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord, they can rest from their labours for their good deeds go before

And the resurrection is also for those left behind. We do think of resurrection in terms of the next life, but it is also for this life. The Risen Lord is ever present- not limited by time or space. He is available to be with us in all the ups and downs of life. Is any DOWN in life greater than a bereavement. He will raise us up by His presence---I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS/ DO NOT LET YOUR HEARTS BE TROUBLED/ COME TO ME ALL YOU WHO LABOUR AND ARE OVERBURDENED AND I WILL GIVE YOU REST.
