Focus

Hidden treasure

The three short parables in today's Gospel - comparing the kingdom of heaven to treasure, a pearl and a fishing net - are unique to Matthew's Gospel. Jesus wants to show the


disciples, and us, that the Kingdom of God is precious - so precious that its discovery requires us to put aside everything else in order to immerse ourselves wholeheartedly in it. We are called to set aside all self-interest, judgement, all our certainties and live the kingdom values of humility, openness and compassion. Jesus emphasises that 'kingdom people' "bring out of their treasure what is new and what is old". This would have resonated with Matthew's community, a mix of Jews and Gentiles who were discerning the parameters of this 'new' movement.

Perhaps the fishing parable, the last in this series of parables, holds the key. It echoes the tone of the parable of the weeds among the wheat - everything is gathered in, a variety, "good" and "bad" alike. As he addresses his disciples, Jesus is aware that they are not perfect. Like us all, they have flaws and weaknesses. Yet we are called to this wide-open vision of Jesus, where all are gathered and none are excluded, and the hidden treasures of the kingdom are revealed. The diversity of this gathering is seen in Jesus' outreach to all those considered 'outside', sinners and tax collectors, Roman centurions, lepers, traitors and deniers. All are gathered. Today, may we look at our own communities and reflect on who is welcome, who is 'invited'.

New Ross Lace—Part II

Extract from The Monastery of Our Lady of
Mount Carmel, New Ross - An insight into

ount Carmel, New Ross - An insight i our way of life in poetry written by Sr. Cora Marie Lawlor



An Industrial Lace School was started in 1833 with the aim of providing the girls of the town with employment and to make them self sufficient. The needlepoint lace which was painstakingly produced by a needle and single thread provided an income for the poor and helped many local families to survive.

Mother Austin Dalton, a native of Ballygub, Inistioge, changed the reputation of New Ross Lace from ordinary to extraordinary, making it one of the most sought after status symbols in the world. Mother Dalton re-discovered the lost art of Venetian Point Lace, through painstakingly undoing stitch by stitch, a sample which chanced to come her way. She then designed variations such as Rose Point, Flat Point, and Needle Point etc., which experts judged to be better than the originals. Samples of this delicate work won awards at Exhibitions around the world—London, Edinburg, Brussels, Paris, Chicago, New York, Buenos Aires etc.

A shawl of Mount Carmel rose—point lace was presented to Queen Victoria on the occasion of her diamond jubilee in 1897. However the regular markets for Mount Carmel Lace was threefold,

- 1) Ecclesiastical, Altar Falls, Vestments, Veils
- 2) High Fashion, Collars, Cuffs, Handkerchiefs & Fan Covers
- 3) Tableware, Tablecloths, Napkins, Doilies

In the early 20th century , the demand for lace dwindled due to the production of synthetic fibres and machine made lace. World War I saw the end of its production in the Monastery. However many skilled lace makers worked from home.

Nowadays New Ross Lace is a treasured heirloom. Samples of the Lace may be seen in museums around the world and the Monastery treasures some precious heirlooms which are now destined to go on public display.
