In the end we are more pleased with the grumpy doer than the smiling non-doer!

Jesus comes back to this often: not those 'who say Lord, Lord will go into the kingdom of heaven'.

We can at times also enjoy the vineyard, sunning ourselves in it as the grapes sun themselves to ripen. Then we are asked to tend it, to care for it, and to bring forth fruit that will last.


