GOSPEL Matthew 20: 1-16 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them. "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here

idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first last.

Forgiveness Fills the Gap

Maybe at the end – the man didn't deserve a day's wage for the work he did, compared to the other like the fellow getting the All Ireland medal for 5 mins play! Is the gospel telling us

that everyone deserves to get enough to live on, and the rest is a bonus? Maybe one or two others saw it that way, and that's the way the kingdom grows. It grows within us in thanks and sharing. That's what we do at every Mass.

Is Jesus pointing the way to the first truth of our faith: that God is supergenerous in love to all? From believing that in the heart, we are empowered to love others like him, or try to. God says in the parable not to be envious "because I am generous". It is only human to find this approach difficult. We very often repay love with love and withdraw love when it is not given. A child will sometimes say after being bold, 'Mammy, do you still love me?

Pope Francis writes: "There are two aspects of love. First, love is more about giving than receiving. Second, love is more about deeds than words. Love is always given or transmitted to another, he said, and "love always gives life, fosters growth." Feast of the Sacred Heart 2016).

The first reading proclaims the generosity of God and God's 'richness in forgiving', a message we need often in our lives. This forgiveness is higher than the gap of heaven and earth, and further it fills this gap.

The gospel invites us to be grateful for God's forgiveness -for myself and everyone else.



BISHOP GER'S MESSAGE

We are living through a time of great change in our Church and our Diocese. During August you will have heard about or read Bishop Ger's pastoral letter outlining the need for training and formation to enable and empower lay people to play a renewed role in the ongoing life of the Church.



The Diocese is inviting women and men to be formed as: Catechists to work with families and children in the Diocese who are preparing for sacraments; Pastoral Care Workers to work with the sick or

housebound and to assist in the time around funerals; Leaders of Parish Prayer with Scripture to lead communities in liturgy; Parish Administrators and Leaders who will work with communities to ensure continuity and viability in the absence of a priest; and Facilitators with Accord to help couples to prepare for the Sacrament of Marriage.

One of the key challenges that Pope Francis put before us, is that as people of faith, we all take responsibility for awakening faith in the lives of people around us but especially in the lives of children and young people. We must do this in a way that is appropriate to the times we live in and in a way that speaks to the lives of people today.

In this Sunday's second reading, we hear that the life and death of each one of us has its influence on others. We live in a time when the voice and the calling of lay people in our church is being restored to the proper place envisaged in 'Vatican 2'.

By virtue of our baptismal vocation we are all called to serve in our Church and to utilise our gifts. Today the Church in Ireland is blessed, in that many people of all ages are involved in specific activities of their local parish. These new ministries will support and expand all the work currently being done in our parishes and offer new possibilities to people already involved and to those who might wish to participate in new ways.

There are people here who might listen to Jesus' advice given in today's Gospel to respond to others from the heart but hesitate to offer themselves for these ministries. But remember that to exercise a ministry in the Church is to share in the ministry of Christ. As Pope Francis has said, the role of the Lay Pastoral Minister is to accompany other disciples with mercy and patience.

The Diocese will hold information meetings in the coming weeks and the details again will be in the Newsletter.

Bishop Ger is asking people to do two things:

- To pray for the success of this venture and that people will be courageous and generous in their
- To encourage people who you think might have the gifts and aptitude for these ministries to apply.
