responsibilities: instead of tending the vineyard entrusted to them, they are only looking after themselves. If we think of the

vineyard as our world, this parable jumps into the modern age. Humanity has been entrusted with this beautiful and bountiful planet. But instead of caring for it and sharing its fruits, our common home has been exploited for profit. The parable is critical of the entitled attitude of those who take but refuse to offer anything in return. Jesus ends with a warning that the precious vineyard will be leased to better tenants - "a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom". We've heard this language before in the Beatitudes, when Jesus says the kingdom belongs to the meek, pure in heart, just, merciful. These are the carers our earth needs. As we continue to celebrate the Season of Creation, may we discern on how

we are each being called to care more deeply for this precious vinevard. We are invited to prayer and to action for this sacred earth. In Laudato Si', Pope Francis pleads with us to embrace an "ecological conversion," whereby the effects of our encounter with Jesus Christ becomes evident in our relationship with the world around us. He says, "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience." (LS, 217).


