Into the Wilderness

Lent is a time to respond to that hunger which lies at the core of our being, the hunger for a deeper connection with the Creator, the hunger to experience freshness in our lives, the hunger for what we truly long for. What better place to work all of this

out than "the wilderness"? From time to time, we are landed in the wilderness. Sometimes it is an unpleasant experience and at other times we crave it, in response to a deep desire to step back from the day-to-day and make space in our lives for reflection. In the short passage we read from Mark today, we see that this is Spirit-led, the same Spirit that descended on Jesus at his baptism and 'immediately drove him out into the wilderness'. In the wilderness we can become vulnerable, thoughts and feelings can attack us like "wild beasts". But we should not be afraid; we also read that 'angels ministered' to Jesus; he is not alone.

There is a Zen proverb, 'Let go or be dragged', and no one wants to be dragged around the place. Lent invites us to embrace this wilderness time. As we fast from things that are not life-giving for us, we are also actively making space for God to breathe life and love into our hearts once more. We do this in the trust that God who loves us wants us to choose life and to clear out the blocks that stand in our way. This is 'good news', a true *metanoia* (a change of heart). God's Kingdom is being fulfilled in us and around us, not yet complete, but with every trip into the wilderness we edge closer to that reality. May this Lenten season be a period of grace for all of us.

History Notes—Part XIII

The Parish Office, Robert Street

The premises, now known as the Parish Office in Robert Street, was built by a Mr. Mc Cormack for the Primitive Methodist congregation in the late 1700s to accommodate three hundred persons. McCormack featured in the Battle of Ross in 1798 as aide to loyalist General Henry Johnson. The famous travelling preacher, John Wesley, preached there. The Methodist mission ended in New Ross in the 1930s. When the parish acquired the building in the 1950s it was in very poor condition. Fr. Pat Doyle gathered a local team of volunteers around him and the building was re-roofed, all joinery, including the floors, was replaced and toilet facilities were added. A major refurbishment of the interior completed preparations, and the hall resumed its old role of public service. Local Catholic organisations met there regularly including the Legion of Mary and Children of Mary, and dances and hops attracted crowds of happy young people. The upstairs part of the building, the old gallery, has been the band practice hall of The Confraternity Brass Band, for many years under the baton of Nick Cooney. Recent refurbishments have further developed excellent parish administration

office facilities and meeting rooms.

The continued success of the Synodal journey already begun in our Diocese requires on-going engagement in our parish communities. As part of this journey seven people will be chosen which will include one Priest and one Religious who will undertake training as facilitators to work with parishes and other groups in the Diocese to continue to develop Synodality in the life and mission of the Church in Ferns. This training will begin in April.

We are also currently preparing two documents one on best practice of synodality n the diocese and the second on How can we imagine the life of the Church in Ireland where people are co-responsible for the Church's mission in different ways. These documents have to be submitted by March 25th and they will be sent as part of the Irish National Synodal Team to Rome for the Synod meeting in October next. Our Holy Father Pope Francis continually reminds us that there can be no Synod without prayer. Please continue to pray for our Synodal journey.
