



History Notes—Part XVIII **UNWITTING EMIGRANTS**

Two young farming brothers from the Ballywilliam area brought a valuable horse to the fair of Ross for sale in the 1840s. The horse made a big price and to celebrate their good fortune the brothers headed downtown for some refreshments before returning home. On the way they met a neighbouring friend and nvited him to join them as their guest. The guay was a hive of activity as a Graves & Co ship was preparing to depart for America. The taverns were crowded with emigrants and their well-wishers and the three from the fair joined in the excitement and the drink flowed. Shortly before sailing time the three decided on the spur of the moment to sail with the emigrants. They purchased their tickets and boarded the outgoing vessel amid the cheers and tears from the quayside. They were well past the Hook before they realised what they had done. On arrival at Ellis Island the brothers became separated from their neighbour and lost touch with him. With some cash in hand the brothers made a success of their adventure. One of them returned home to run the family farm but the
