Jesus assures his disciples that he is risen from the dead and sends them to preach the gospel in his name. He assures us of this too, and we are sent to be his people in our family, among our friends, in all parts of the world.





The disciples were shattered. They had believed that Jesus was the one sent by God to Israel. But they had seen him die. It had all been a big mistake. Their faith in Jesus had been a delusion. They had been let down badly and were preparing

to go back to their former way of life, as fishermen, tax-collectors. We too may feel that way at times and wonder is our faith, too, in Jesus a big delusion? We might have no problem in believing that Jesus was a great teacher. We can easily identify with his call to "love one another." But do we really believe that Jesus rose from the dead and is now alive and present to us? It was only through a personal encounter with the risen Jesus that the disciples came to believe. So, too, it is only through a personal relationship with Jesus, a relationship which is nourished by regular prayer, that we can truly believe that Jesus is alive and present to us. Jesus is not an object of belief but the subject of experience. The Easter season challenges us to ask ourselves do we really believe. And the test of our belief is whether, like the disciples after their own personal encounter with Jesus, we go out to continue what Jesus began, namely to serve and not be served, to love "as I have loved you," and thereby grow the Kingdom of God on earth.

THEY NEVER CAME HOME

A unit of United Irishmen, some 20 strong, from Sutton's Parish in the Ballykelly / Horeswood area joined the rebel army on Corbett Hill on the eve of the Battle of Ross on 5the June 1798. They were mounted and armed and they left their horses at the farm presently owned by Michael Keating at Creacon for collection after the battle. They fought on foot all day, carrying their wounded with them Late in the day when the battle had turned, they were trapped in a laneway by dragoons and cut to pieces. Only two survived and those two had the unenviable task of returning the horses to the families of their fallen comrades with the sad news. Two Suttons were among the men who never came home.
