Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the Passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.

Our mood today for this feast is of thanks and wonder, that the God of heaven and earth would come to us in such an ordinary way, without our help he could not come.... without the farmer there is no wheat; without the baker there is no bread, without the priest no consecration and without the minister of the Eucharist he would just stay on the altar!

So, each time we receive communion we are joyfully receiving his love for ourselves, and also the call to share our love. Our receiving communion is both this call and a help to live our lives in love.

History Notes—Part XXVII

"WE ARE IN RIGHT TROUBLE NOW"
When the President Kennedy entourage visited New Ross in 1962, I was in the throng to welcome him on the Quay (and have the photo to prove it!). When all the visiting guests were seated on the platform before a huge crowd, chairman Andy Mihihan (referred to by the President as Mayor Minihan) took the microphone to open proceedings. Just as he was about to start, the local PA system went dead. Andy did not realise that the main radio system broadcasting to America and the world was still live, as he commented "We're in right trouble now!" His remark was greeted with a roar of mirth. After a short pause, Gerald Ward and his son, in charge of the system, quickly put matters to rights. It transpired that a travelling security man noticed batteries with cables attached under the platform as Andy was about to speak. Fearing a bomb, he quickly tore the cables away. "We're in right trouble now!" became the byword for Andy for years afterwards.
The platform party was entertained by a short performance of Irish dance tunes by the local céile group, with Tom Brothers of Michael Street, in the middle of the front row. His son, Pete, who had long ago emigrated to Sacramento in California, was watching proceedings there. He suddenly sprang to his feet and rushed to the TV. pointing excitedly "Look, there's my Daddy!"
