In today's Gospel, Jesus appears to be quite rude, dismissive
of his mother and relatives. St. Mark's Gospel was written in
order to reveal Jesus as the Son of God. Would St. Mark not
have been better to omit this story altogether, as it seems to

portray the Son of God in a not very good light? But perhaps Mark includes this
story because it is so important. Many of the early Christians found themselves
in conflict with their family and their Jewish community, who wanted nothing to do
with them because they had abandoned the faith of their fathers and converted
to Christianity. Some were rejected by their friends and sacked from their
employment. They were tempted to give up their Christian beliefs and return to
the comfort of their Jewish way of life. In those parts of the world where Christians
are a persecuted minority, this sense of exclusion and hostility is still a reality of
life for them. But this story reminds them, and us, that, as Christians, our family
goes beyond the nuclear family, or the tribe, or country, to which we belong, and
extends to the whole human race. Perhaps Jesus wanted to encourage them to
continue as Christians by reminding them, and us, that we now have a new family,
a global community, to which we belong. Christians exclude no-one from their
love, even if we ourselves are sometimes excluded by others.

History Notes—Part XXVII I THE KERLOGUE HEROICS

The Stafford ship, The Kerlogue, was homeward bound from Portugal with a cargo of oranges for Dublin on 29th September 1943, when it received a distress call from a German plane to head southwest. A major sea battle had just taken place in which a German destroyer and other craft had been sunk in an engagement with the British navy. On arriving at the battle scene, the Kerlogue crew were faced with a mass of corpse in life jackets and men desperately clinging to wreckage. For ten hours in rough seas until darkness the Kerlogue men hauled survivors on board their small 140ft craft and stuffed them into every available nook and cranny until it could take no more. The oranges cargo helped save the survivors from dehydration. Captain Tom Donoghue then headed for the nearest port, which was Cobh, sending a message by Morse code for medical and other assistance. He ignored an instruction from the British Admiralty to land the surviving German sailors at Fishguard and when challenged later for refusing to comply, his answer was that his primary concern was to save lives. The rescued German sailors were interned in the Curragh military camp until after the war. They were very well fed and looked after. They attended the Curragh races where they sold home-made doughnuts to racegoers, they worked with local farmers and made day trips to Dublin and some attended university courses in UCD. When the war ended in 1945 the internees were handed over to the British army for repatriation to Germany.
