

Jesus comes among us as one like us - his own people were surprised at his goodness and his powers. He comes among us today in the ordinariness of his people, in their needs and in their love.





We label people all the time. Labels are helpful as they tell us something about the person which can be useful to know. So, someone is a Catholic, or a Jew or a Muslim. Or an ex-prisoner or a drug user or a homeless person, or

a successful business woman. But the label does not define the person; it tends to put the person in a box and we can come to judge them by the size and colour of the box, which often reflects the biases and prejudices which we have developed. Labels can make it more difficult for us to see the unique, extraordinary person that lies behind the label. Everyone, every homeless person, every drug user, every prisoner, has a story to tell, a story which strips away the label and reveals the uniqueness of their lives and their vulnerability. The people that Jesus grew up with were unable to recognise the person behind the label. "Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary." Certainly, they wondered where he had got his wisdom and how he worked miracles in curing people, but that only helped to define the box they had put him in. We too can sometimes put Jesus into a box, seeing him as merely a moral teacher, and so preventing us from recognising him as the unique revelation of God. Jesus was not just a good teacher. Everything He said and did was God's word to our world.

History Notes - Part XXXI

THE OLD BALLADMAKER

Before the days of mass media when radio, TV and other the modern methods of communication were undreamed of, the balladmaker was a key chronicler in describing important local happenings. His skill was in composing verses, sometimes set to music detailing key local events. He performed his compositions at fairs and other gatherings and sold printed copies for a few pence. The best remembered Wexford balladeer was Michael O'Brien, whose '98 composition Ballyshannon Lane, still sung by Paddy Berry of Drinagh, was a favourite. Closer to home was Pat Hickey, who lived on the slopes of Sliabh Coilte near Killesk on the Duncannon Road. Pat was no mean composer; his last initiative in ballad tradition was associated with the visit of President Kennedy to New Ross in 1962. Pat composed a ballad of welcome which he planned to perform for the crowds as an example of the ancient ballad tradition. He also had an armful of copies printed on thin pink paper which he intended to distribute to his audience. However, when Pat arrived at the entrance to the event he was met by Gardai and security staff who had no knowledge or understanding of Pat's mission. They mistook him for a nuisance or troublemaker and refused him entry. Courtesy of Jim Sutton
