He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:



World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

The times we live in show that we are not relating to the Earth as a gift from our Creator, but rather as a resource to be used.

Only when we work together with Creation can the first fruits of hope be born.





In today's Gospel Jesus is once again questioned about the actions of his followers who this time are accused of eating with 'unclean hands'. He responds with a quote from the prophet Isaiah criticising those who honour God in word but not in their hearts. We may notice that he doesn't speak out against the laws about ritual cleanliness but

focuses instead on interior disposition. Jesus has a powerful message for us about the tension between outward appearances and what's going on on the inside. It is not rigid laws or rituals that are important but the true nature of our hearts.

Today marks the beginning of the Season of Creation where we are called into an awareness of our planet's growing ecological crisis. Humans have impacted the natural world most negatively in the past 200 years. Yet the crisis also conveys a deeper message of humanity's fractured relationship with God's creation. At the heart of the ecological crisis is a spiritual crisis. We have become disconnected from the earth, our relationship with God's creation has become fractured. Pope Francis reminds us, 'We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it' (LS, §139). We

are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it' (LS, §139). We cannot separate our relationship with God from our relationship with God's creation. A radical change of heart, is essential if we are to begin to repair our relationship with the natural world. In today's Gospel Jesus challenges us to examine our relationships with ourselves and others. What human traditions or worldly things do we 'cling' to? Do we recognise our inherent connectedness with the world around us, not separate from it but a part of it? Our interior awareness, the love we cultivate in our hearts for creation and humanity, will be evident in our relationship to other creatures and to the world around us. May we use this time to rekindle a sense of awe and wonder for God's creation and discern where we are being called to in order to protect it.





History Notes - Part XLIII

A

RED MICK O'BRIEN, FAMOUR BALLADMAKER

Red Mick O'Brien was born in Black Cow Street in Wexford in the 1800s. He was the most famous ballad writer of his era. Known as The Rambling Bard, he was described as the poet laureate of the Land League. His skill as a ballad writer made him famous in county Wexford. His best -known ballad is Ballyshannon Lane, a tale of '98, regularly sung by Paddy Berry of Drinagh. Red Mick's deep baritone voice and his wife's shrill soprano voice could be heard over the din of fairs and markets, race meetings and football matches. Printed copies of his ballads could be bought for a penny. My father remembered him on Campile fair and if sales of ballad sheets were good, husband and wife would both retire to the local pub for sustenance. The subject of his ballads was sometimes controversial, describing eviction scenes or other confrontations with the law. He is quoted as saying "let who like make the laws, so long as I make the ballads". The ballad sheets were best sellers, though their sales were often forbidden by law. If Mick detected a policeman in mufti among his audience, he would defy the law by selling you a straw and giving you the ballad as a present. Courtesy of Jim Sutton
