The disciples were arguing about who was the most important. We can all identify with their argument! Today, we often value people by their achievements. A person who runs a successful business employing dozens of people will

be considered more important than a person who is unemployed or homeless. The value that society places on them is often reflected in the salary they are paid. However, during Covid, this value judgement was challenged. Nurses, bus drivers, carers and other essential personnel, who do not command enormous salaries, were recognised and highly valued for the work that they were doing (unfortunately that didn't last!). Today's Gospel affirms a central belief in our Christian faith, namely everyone has the same value before God. and therefore should be equally valued by the followers of Jesus. A little child has no achievements to boast of, they were the "least" in the society of Jesus' time. To be great in God's eyes, we must make ourselves the "least" by becoming the servant of all. We must put other people, and their needs, before ourselves, just as a servant puts their master's needs first. When Jesus washed the feet of the disciples at the Last Supper, he took on the role of a servant and the disciples found themselves in the role of a master. When Jesus hung on the cross, He was the servant giving his life for us. It is in serving others, putting their needs before ourselves, that we become great in the Kingdom of God.

History Notes - Part XLV I

THE MAIT STORES

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The business of PJ Roche & Sons, Maltsters, was traditionally referred to in town as "The Malt Stores". The stores were tall buildings of several floors for storage and processing of barley into malt. The best example of the old Roche malt store building (of which there were seven in town) stands intact at the corner of the Quay and Charles Street and houses the Ross Tapestry project at present. South Wexford and south Kilkenny are wellknown barley growing areas and much of the barley crop were purchased by Roche Maltings for converting into malt for Guinness each year from 1853 onwards. The malt manufacturing process involved drying and heat-processing the grain and required a large workforce. Roches were for years the biggest employer in town, but the work was seasonal, and many malt store workers turned to salmon fishing in the Barrow in the Spring/Summer months. The work of moving the grain from farmer's carts at harvest time to storage and later transfer to the heated malt processing floors was very heavy and labourintensive. The workers on the hot malt processing floors wore special footwear and light clothing provided by the company and used wide flat timber malt shovels as they turned and tended the product. Three-masted schooners such as the De Wadden, The Simric and The Elly Park carried the finished malt to Guinness in Dublin. The traditional malting process was eventually overtaken by newer and more modern methods and while the Roche family still live at Woodville, they are no longer involved in malting. However, the New Ross area continues to be an important assembly point for the rich barley crops of its hinterland. Courtesy of Jim Sutton
