

History Notes - Part XLV V

The Daubney Fountain
The Daubney Fountain once stood opposite the Tholsel. It was moved slightly down the street to accommodate the magnificent monument of the '98 pikeman. Old Laurence Collection photos show both memorials, with a fountain flowing into the bowl of the Daubney statue. This area was the site of the fish market in the early 1900s and local fishmongers found the fountain very convenient for gutting and washing their fish for sale. The result was that there was a constant all-pervading smell of rotting fish in the square opposite the Tholsel. However, the problem was solved when someone, reputed to be a local publican, took a sledge to the bowl during the hours of darkness, so that the waters flowed fresh and free afterwards. I got this story from my mother. The Dabuney Fountain now stands in the town park beside the large stone pikeman, with the outline of the smashed bowl still visible.
