It's good to be reminded of the world of our origins and our goal. We come from $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$ and we go to $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$.

When we hear that, it can be frightening. It's about what we don't know. But is it not one of the biggest joys in life – that I come from God, I am going to God and in between believe God is with me, God is with us?

History Notes - Part 49

CHERRY'S BREWERY

The original Creywell site had a chequered history. It was occupied by a distillery which failed in the early 1800s and then became a bank operated by Colclough & Co. In the days before limited liability was available to such ventures, private banks frequently became over-leant and failed, to the ruination of the investors. This fate befell the Creywell bank after one of the partners, John Colclough of Tintern, a member of Parliament for Wexford, was killed in a duel with William Congreve Alcock of Wilton Castle at Ardcandrisk in 1807. John Colclough is thought to have been the expert banking partner, so that the other partners decided to close down. Before they could do so, however, a run of creditors on their inadequate liquid resources compelled them to close doors in 1808. The gross liabilities of the bank were fifty times the amount of capital invested. The property was later bought by Thomas Cherry of Waterford who established a brewery there. The name Cherry's XXX Strong Ale was well-known in the south-east for many decades. The Creywell operation was bought by Guinness in 1952 and brewing by Guinness, using the Cherry's ale licence, was transferred to Waterford. It is said that for a very short time during the paperwork transferring shareholdings between Cherry's and Guinness, the New Ross brewery was technically the owner of all the shares of Guinness. **Courtesy of Jim Sutton**
