



History Notes - Part 72 WILLIAM DOWSLEY - SNIPER

During the days immediately before the Battle of Ross on 5th June 1798, a group of Ross men sympathetic to the cause of defending the town against rebel attack, formed

themselves into a body named The Unarmed Loyalists. The leader of this group was James Alexander. They busied themselves in helping the royalist troops to barricade the town and prepare it for the imminent onslaught. The Unarmed Loyalist wore a white paper emblem in the hats to distinguish them from other townspeople. They were quickly hurried off the streets by the military when the action commenced.

William Dowsley lived in a house on the left-hand side of Mary Street immediately below the gated convent steps leading up to the old Augustinian church. Across the road was Bakehouse Lane, in which rebels hid from the withering artillery fire from the defenders at the Tholsel. William Dowsley manned the upstairs window and with several muskets, loaded for him by two old soldiers, kept deadly fire on the rebels advancing from Bakehouse Lane. As the battle progressed and the rebels gained a foothold in the laneways off Mary Street, Dowsley's house was broken into and himself and his assistants were despatched. A family in south Wexford claim that an ancestor was involved in neutralising the Dowsley stronghold. Dowsley's Barn is named after the family. Courtesy of Jim Sutton
