It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.

Easter is a promise of God's peace, the promise of today's gospel. A peace which is at the depth of all life's turmoil, a calm beneath every storm.





"My peace I give to you" (Jn 14:27). The word for the peace that Jesus gives in our Gospel today is *Shalom*, a Hebrew word used to say hello and goodbye. Yet, it also carries a much deeper meaning. *Shalom* signifies a peace that people long for, a wholeness, completeness, fulfilment. Jesus tells us that this

Shalom is a peace that the world does not give (Jn 14:27). Therefore, it comes through cultivating a deep awareness of the Divine Spirit within our hearts, "our home". This is the true peace we long for, but there are so many obstacles and distractions in our way.

To give an example, one of the drivers of the ecological crisis our world is currently facing is over-consumption. In *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis' encyclical on the environment, he notes that at the root of this crisis is a deep spiritual crisis. We are constantly trying to bring fulfilment to our lives by having the next upgrade, the next new 'thing'. This over-consumption is driven by the market, but it only succeeds because we are not at peace with ourselves. Goods are marketed to fill a gap. Unbridled consumerism, at its heart, is driven by a lack of peace. In contrast, the peace that Christ offers is freely given, waiting to be tapped into and comes from a loving interior relationship with God which brings us wholeness. Perhaps this week you can use the word Shalom as a mantra. Bring this into contemplation.

"When we understand the essential unity of all that is, we discover the possibility of 'peace' – the king of peace that in Hebrew is called, Shalom, which is infinitely more than an absence of strife; it is the wholeness of the web of life itself and of every creature in it, held in the wholeness of the one God." (Margaret Silf)



### **History Notes - Part 74** ON THE JOB

Andrew Cullen, builder of our parish church in the 1890s was a very thorough and conscientious supervisor of the day-to-day work. The building site was surrounded by a hoarding with a main gateway at Robert Street. The workmen were hired and paid on a quarter-day basis, rather than by the hour as nowadays. Workers were expected to be on the job and ready to start on the dot; the gateway was closed promptly at the start of the pay period, and latecomers were simply locked out, and lost a quarter-day's pay. The building of the church was an important source of employment for tradesmen and general workers alike and a job on the building was much sought after. The transport of the huge granite pillars attracted much attention; arriving at the guay to be hauled on site by Cullen's steam engine (threshing was part of the Cullen enterprises). Various snags were met and dealt with during the course of the work. The steeple was planned for the Robert Street side of the main doorway but had to be moved to the Cross Street side, because of difficulty with foundations. A long flight of steps was to run from the front yard down through Cross Street carpark to South Street, but this was not included, probably again for difficulties with the foundations. Some extra ground was required at the back and at the Cross Street boundary of the site - this was secured through the good offices of the very influential parish priest, Dean Kavanagh. The blessing of the cross on the church spire was also performed personally by the Dean, who climbed all the way to the top of the contractor's scaffolding to perform the act.

The following exchange occurred between Andrew Cullen, on his morning rounds, and old Johnny Bailey, painting contractor, working high in the scaffolding:

Cullen: "Are you up, Johnny?"

Bailey: "I am"

Cullen: "I don't hear you working?"

Bailey: "I'm not putting it with a hammer!"
