

Today is our celebration that Jesus is present always with us, in signs we can recognise but not understand.

It is a feast of the mystery of his presence, always close to his people.





Thousands of people spent the whole day listening to Jesus. In the evening, the disciples approached Jesus and said, "Jesus, would you ever stop talking, the people are hungry, send them off to the towns and villages to get something

to eat." The early Church understood Jesus' reply, "Give them something yourselves to eat," as an instruction to their community that the community was to ensure that all the needs of all its members were met by the community. It was to be a community who cared for each other, who shared what they had so that all would have enough where the needs of others came first. If there was not enough food for all to eat, then everyone went hungry. At the last supper, Jesus said, "This is my body, which will be given up for you," and "This is my blood, which will be poured out for you," and then he said, "Do this in memory of me." By "this" Jesus was asking his disciples to sacrifice themselves for others, just as he was about to do for them. At the Eucharist. we worship Jesus, present on the altar, but we may, (conveniently!), forget his instructions. To follow Jesus is to live the way he lived – a life of compassion - and to die the way he died - the ultimate act of compassion - by giving ourselves, our resources, our talents, our time, our very being, to the service of others, even at a heavy cost to ourselves. We go to Mass, not to do our duty, but to re-commit ourselves to doing our duty after we have left Mass.

<u> History Notes - Part 78</u> THE CROSSWORDS

In my mother's time, the Sunday Independent Crossword was a great favourite before being overtaken by radio and tv. The puzzle appeared each Sunday with a weekly prize fund of £250 (pre euro) and with about twelve questions to be answered. Each entry coupon cost six old pence. Most of the questions and answers were relatively staightforward but there were always a couple of tricky ones. For example a question where the key word in the answer might be <u>could</u> or <u>would</u> or should caused much deliberation. The prize monies turned on such questions. The results appeared in the following Sunday Independent. Each Tuesday a leaflet named "Solutions" was for sale at newsagents which reviewed the previous week's crossword and suggested solutions for the following week's competition. My mother's friend Mary Ann who lived in William Street visited us each Wednesday night and over cups of tea, and armed with "Solutions", discussed the detail of the next week's askings. The tricky questions caused much thought and deliberation on "which answer was the most apt". I was sent to the post office next day for "a sixpenny postal order and a tuppence halfpenny stamp" and the wait commenced for the following Sunday. The £250 prizefund was usually shared between a number of entrants but occasionally one lucky person swept the lot – a worthwhile sum in those days. The only local full £250 prizewinner in my memory was Mickey Walsh who lived in Michael Street. An admiring neighbour enquired the secret of his success - "I put the right word in the right place!" replied Mickey. **Courtesy of Jim Sutton**
