<u> History Notes - Part 76</u> The Workhouse Riot 1887

The south Wexford area was quite unsettled during the Land War of the 1880s when land rent strikes and evictions were common and the National League supported the landed tenants against the landlord class. The New Ross Workhouse was unwittingly drawn into the conflict when evicted tenants sought and received shelter there. The Workhouse or Poorhouse was on Poorhouse Road, now called Hospital Road. There was discontent and unrest in the workhouse which descended into a riot. According to press reports, a large crowd of inmates led by women, attacked the guardian McAuliffe with a crowbar and he retreated with his assistant Wall to the boardroom followed by inmates. They threw stones and broke windows and Wall managed to escape into town, followed by a number of women pelting him with stones and mud. He reached the police barracks in Priory Street, while McAuliffe and other staff had barricaded themselves in the boardroom. The inmates continued to run riot and wreck the Workhouse until the police arrived. The local police inspector, Henry Cary, attributed the riots to 'the resignation of the workhouse officers by order of the National League and an attempt to classify women by separating bad characters from the rest' Courtesy of Jim Sutton
