There is no point in pretending before God: he sees us exactly as we are. If we place ourselves honestly and humbly in his presence then our prayer will be heard.



Prayerfulness is what makes our witness to Christ credible and effective. Without prayer in our lives our witnessing will have an empty sound to it.

According to St. John Damascene, prayer is the raising of the mind and heart to God to praise, worship and adore him, and to ask him to grant what we need. Prayer takes time and attention. Time today is a very valuable commodity. Many cannot find time for prayer. There is no short-cut or fast-track prayer; we must be prepared to sacrifice something we greatly value if we are serious about prayer: precious time.

Prayer should come from an honest heart. When we pray for peace our own lives should be marked by peace with those around us. If we pray for peace while at the same time nursing a grudge against someone, our prayer will lack an element of integrity and be less effective.

We do not pray to inform God about our needs. He already knows what we really need. We pray to present ourselves before God to tell our story, admit our faults and to become more aware that God's love covers everything, including our sins.

We pray to find peace so we can once again feel good, let go of the day's failures, get some sleep, and start again tomorrow.

Regular prayer renews us, gets us back on track, and gives us fresh courage to go forward. Prayerfulness is an awareness of the continuing presence of God, the capacity to walk in touch with God through everything in life.





# History Notes - Part 95:

THE EARLIEST RECORDING OF NEW ROSS King John landed at Passage with a large army on the 20th June

1210. His primary aim was to establish and confirm his lordship over his Norman subjects, who had invaded Ireland some forty years earlier. His financial records give an accurate account of his tour. On 21st June he arrived in our town and addresed correspondence from Pons Novis Villa Willielmi Marescalli meaning The Town of the New Bridge of William Marshall. This record makes it plain that there was already a town (or the beginings of one), created by William Marshall in 1210, as the term Villa was used in Norman French to denote town. It also shows that the town was already linked to the Kilkenny side of the Barrow by a bridge. William Marshall visited Ireland briefly, twice, where his main seat was at Kilkenny and it is thought that his wife, Isabella, grand-daughter of Diarmaid McMurrough (who invited the Normans to Ireland in 1169), was mainly responsible for the development of our town. She is shown leaning over the mapping table at the building of St. Mary's in the Ros Tapestry panel Gothic Glory. King John with his army proceeded across the bridge to the manor of William FitzAnthony whose association is preserved in its name Baile Mhic Andáin, Thomastown, and then on to Kilkenny.
