SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT 7th December 2025

The message of repentance during this season of Advent is a call to each one of us to look deeply into our lives, to renew and deepen our relationship with God.

PREPARE THE WAY



Growing up in the 1950s and 60s, I was told that holiness, my relationship with God, consisted in obeying the laws, which the Church told me God had laid down. Sin was defined as a breaking of these laws. Matthew focuses John

the Baptist's ire on the Pharisees and Sadducees, those religious leaders who also demanded, in God's name, exact obedience to the multiplicity of laws that they had laid down. The religious leaders, Jesus said, had "tied up heavy burdens and laid them on peoples' shoulders" (Matt 23 v 4). This focus on obedience to laws often led to a feeling of righteousness, and a sense of superiority over those who did not, or could not, obey the laws (Pharisee and the Publican, Luke 18 v 9-14). They were sinners who were rejected and excluded by God and therefore should be rejected and excluded by the people of God. The law was intended to show people how to love God and to love one another, but the religious leaders had made it, not just a substitute, but an obstacle, to the development of a relationship to God. When Jesus, out of compassion, healed the sick on the Sabbath, he was condemned for "breaking the law" by working on the Sabbath. St. Paul reminds us that all the commandments can be summed up in this phrase, "Love is the fulfilment of the law." (Romans 13 v 8-10). Jesus revealed that God's passion is not the observance of laws; God's passion is compassion. We are called to holiness, to grow into the image and likeness of God, by growing in compassion.



History Notes - Part 101: THE NEW ROSS CONFRATERNITY BAND

Fr. Denis Carton, curate of New Ross Parish and Director of the Confraternity had the idea in 1936 of forming a brass band in town. A collection was organised and a full range of second hand instruments was bought from an English supplier. The first band paraded with white sashes over the left shoulder as uniforms had not yet been secured. Mr. Flannery from Waterford was the first bandmaster who taught the many local young men to master their instruments. The town was very proud of the marching band in their blue jackets and white trousers as they led many parades with their marching tunes. Several sets of brothers were members over the years, including Shannons, Rossiters, Kielthys, Warrens, Bennets, Spencers and Roches. The first band hall was in Marsh Lane - the premises is now used by the Sea Scouts. A feature of the band hall was a billiard table for members enjoyment – an ideal facility to attract newcomers. On St. Patrick's Day, 1937, the band led by Mr Flannery paraded around the town and gave its first public perfomance. The band has a proud record of never missing a St. Patrick's Day parade. After the most part of a century, the Band marches on, sustained by many young members, both male and female, including descendants of former members. When local curate, Fr. Fortune died in 1939, the band attended and played him to his last resting place with one of its favourite marches - the Harlech March "Will ye no come back again". **Courtesy of Jim Sutton**
