

JOHN 1:5



Today's Gospel, the Prologue of John, is one of the most poetic, symbolic, and theologically rich passages in our Scriptures. It places Christ at the very dawn of time, at the creation of the world, and is unequivocal in its assertion of his full humanity and full divinity.

The imagery of light is particularly striking in this passage: it is a powerful, illuminating beam, which cannot be swallowed up in darkness. In the Nativity of Our Lord, which we have just celebrated, the birth of Jesus defies the odds by emerging in a very dark, grim situation. John contextualises this today by bathing the birth of a small baby in the eternal light beaming from God the Father. This is where Jesus's power comes from, and this power to become a child of God is shared with us, when we accept the Lord into our hearts and our lives. We do this by allowing God's light to shine through us: to illuminate both our own paths and those of others, safe in the conviction that our light will always cut through the darkness even if, at certain times, we are around a corner and cannot see its healing, almighty beam.

This Prologue also highlights the divine sacredness of the Word of God. Somewhat incongruous with a disposable paper leaflet you hold in your hands! As Mary handled the new-born Jesus with the utmost love and reverence, we too are called to treat the Word with the same care.!

History Notes - Part 104:

THE CANONS REGULAR OF SAINT AUGUSTINE -

The Regular Canons, sometimes called Austin Canons, were the first priests to minister in the new Norman town of New Ross. They were quite distinct from the later Augustinian Order which succeeded them. The Canons Regular emerged as a result of efforts of Popes and Councils to induce priests to renounce private property, to recite the divine office and live as a community. The early Austin Canons were men of the Norman race and were spiritual lords and had seats in the national parliament. These included Patrick Barrett from the Kells house of Austin Canons who resided at Mount Garret castle and was Bishop of Ferns in 1400. The early town churches, which predated the Great Church of St. Saviour's (now St. Mary's) in Mary Street, included St. Evins church. The Canons lived in community beside St. Evin's which had its narrow grounds and little cemetry at John Street. Though they resembled monks, they undertook full parocial duties in the town and were subject to the Bishop. St. Evin's continued in operation for some three hundred years until the dissolution of monasteries in the mid-sixteenth century. The Order of Canons Regular was itself a victim of the dissolution but re-emerged as today's Augustinian Friars who ministered in town until recent years and still serve the town at Good Counsel

History Notes - Part 105:

BILL THE TRIPPER

Bill was an enthusiastic member of Camblin Rovers Football Club in the early days of the last century. But he was a useless footballer, and, despite continuous practice, could never get his place on the team. On is way back from a match, with his football boots on the handlebars of his bike, to the boys enquiring at the crossroads whether he made the team, his answer was always the same – "they had enough".

Bill lived on the by- road off Moge Nowlan's Hill in Camblin – this by-road now leads past Creacon Lodge. His house was beside Matt Bowe's forge and Bill had goalposts in the field behind his house where he practiced. With his wife as goalkeeper, Bill would solo alone from midfield and crash the ball past her in goal, shouting "Come out and meet me, you coward!" One moonlight summer's night, Bill's colleagues were returing at a very late hour from Long's Pub in Ballykelly when they heard a football hop – Bill was practicing alone in the moonlight. The boys crept quietly into Bill's field and stripped to their boots near the ditch. When the ball came near them, they ran out towards it, shouting. Poor Bill was panic-stricken and nearly took the back door off it's hinges in flight.
